He initially discussed the prevailing conditions in the society and how to deal with them. He instructed girls with different self-defense techniques in order to combat and cope-up with odd situation.

Along with this they also explained and demonstrated the techniques to decorate the Salad and its presentation.



After this session students left for their project works in the community while focusing on Environment Conservation, Health and Hygiene.



Post lunch a Guest lecture on 'Skin Care and Skin Diseases' by Dr Vivek Rungta, Skin Specialist was organized in the A V Hall. Dr Rungta started by explaining the structure of the skin, the different layers and the role of Nutritive food in its upkeep. He talked about the different skin problems faced by the girls and also answered the queries of the students in this regard.

This was followed by a Guest lecture on 'Care and Well-being of Infants' by **Dr. Anshu Mathur**, Pediatrician. While focusing on Care of the New Born , she also talked about the significance of lactation, essential for the healthy growth of a baby. This was a very important message that she said that the students should carry in the community, the Aanganbaris and even in their homes.

After this the students left for the community to carry out their Projects assigned to them.



After Lunch Guest lecture on Soft Skills, by **Dr. Shruti Rawal**,was held in which Dr. Rawal shared the significance of good communication skills to put forth one's point of view clearly. She focused on the clarity of thought and assertion to make a point and be understood by others. This session was followed by Nukkad training and Self Defence Training.

The Fifth day started with Yoga session by Yoga instructor Ms. Janaki Pareek after which the volunteers took a short break for breakfast. The first lecture of the day was a skill building demonstration on Baking Cakes and Muffins by Ms Sheikh Sahar. She demonstrated how to make basic cake first and thereafter make improvisations to further give a variety. She also told th students how this skill has made her earn some money and now she gets orders and supports herself with her fees. The students reallty enjoyed the session.



After this the students left for the community to carry out their Projects assigned to them.



After Lunch Nukkad Natak Training was resumed which was followed by a session on Intellectual Transformation by Dr. Manoj Khurana. Dr. Khurana came up with a formula which was CLEAR (Choice is yours,Love what you do and do what you love, Enquire within, Act from inspiration and Routine practice of four R's: reflect, recognize, remove, replace and rise). He stated that the basic CLEAR phenomenon is essential to bring about intellectual transformation in any individual. This lecture was enjoyed by the students very much . This lecture was followed by Self defence Training.



The Sixth day of the camp also started with Yoga session by Yoga instructor Ms. Janaki Pareek after which the volunteers took breakfast. The first lecture on this day was on the topic "Against Sexual Harassment" by Arman Team. This team is formed by young boys and girls who are empowering the young girls against any sort of Sexual harassment. They talked about different ways by which harassment takes place and also discussed the ways to counter it. The students like everydaty went to the community to carryout their projects. Today was the day to show their Nukkad to th people in the community. The students performed Nukkad in Gyan Vihar School, Dadabari Basti, and Kalyanpura

Government School. Their presentation enthralled all the school Kids and their messages were well taken by the people of the community too.

After lunch the ppt presentation of all the activities undertaken by the four groups was taken up followed by Nukkad Natak Competition The volunteers had conducted many activities in the bastis related to their projects. They made a presentation of the activities conducted by them in the community. Each group showcased their activities in the community allotted to them vividly in a PPT presentation. Active participation of all campers was sought in these group Projects and its presentation which was followed by a Nukkad Natak also based on the same theme in a competition.

Nukkad Presentation was judged by a panel consisting of Mr Mohammed Ali, Freelance Trainer; Dr. Oby Nagar, Professor, Obstretics and Gynecology, SMS Medical College and Ms. Ridhsidh Singh, Coordinator for IAS Preparatory Classes, The IIS University. The street play presentation on literacy and Social Evils bagged the first and second prize respectively.NSS Programme Officer Dr Sharad Rathore thanked the judges and the students.

The seventh day of the camp also started with Yoga session by Yoga instructor Ms. Janaki Pareek after which the volunteers took breakfast and took off for a Sensitization visit to Sarthak Manav Kusthashram, Galtaji. LECTURE ON AVIAN CONSERVATION

4 January 2016

The degradation of the environment in the present times has affected all the living beings on this planet-whether human beings, fauna, flora and even the climate and the weather etc. In this degradation the humans have a large role as they have exploited the environment mindlessly leading to increasing levels of pollution, deforestation, mining of the resources leading to the depletion of the Ozone layer etc. All these man made activities have resulted in alteration in the pattern of the cycle of nature and global warming etc. We with our actions have also adversely affected the animal and plant world by cutting down the forests and displacing both. In the rat-race of the time we have further become cold hearted towards the pains and agonies of the living world. On the festival of MakarSakranti, we fly kites and enjoy mindlessly and have no concern for the avian world. Thus to make the people aware of the hard times that the birds face due to kite flying on the day of MakarSakranti and the careless attitude of the people to pay no attention to the birds so injured with the glass coated Manjha, the Aavian conservation awareness lecture was organized on 4th January , 2016. 140 NSS Volunteers participated for the same.

The team of volunteers headed by Rohit Gangwal from RakshaOrganisation of Jaipur interacted with 140 NSS volunteers. The lecture was focused on the avian conservation in the light of the arrival of the festive season of Makar Sankranti. Mr. Gangwal told that the sky belongs to the birds and we encroach their space by flying kites just hampering their flights. So we should take care to not fly the kites between 6 to 8 in the morning and 4 to 7 in the evening. The second important point that he raised is to stop the use of glass coated maanja for flying kites as the birds get cuts and are injured and sometime loose their life too and are unable to fly forever. Thirdly he informed about the Bird-relief camp which this NGO would set up at 3 places in the city where the injured birds could be brought for treatment. And lastly he shared the helpline number through which a mere phone call would be enough on which a volunteer from Raksha would take the injured bird for treatment.

On his occasion it was decided that to hold a joint rally in the Mansarovar area on 8^{th} January at 9.30 a.m.

AVIAN CONSERVATION RALLY WITH RAKSHA

8 January 2016

On the 8th January 2016 an avian conservation rally was organized with the purpose of making the public aware about bird injuries due to kite flying. About 300 volunteers of NSS assembled near the Housing Board Office at Agarwal Farm, Mansarovar at 9.30 a.m. The rally was flagged off by Ms. Sunita Jain, Patron of Raksha and Prof Sharad Rathore, NSS Programme officer, The IIS University. The students in files of three walked across Madhyam Marg, via Durgadas Park and reached B-2 bypass and finally converged in the IIS University campus. VIVEKANANDA JAYANTI

12 January 2016

To commemorate the 150th birth anniversary of Swami Vivekananda a programme was organised at The IIS University auditorium by NSS Units of the IIS University Jaipur. 130 NSS Volunteers participated in the same It was also aimed to acquaint the youth with the philosophy of Swamiji and the ideals for which he lived and worked to act as a great source of inspiration for the Youth. Dr. Poonam Sharma from the Department of Political Science delivered a speech in which she shared the life history and thoughts of Swami Vivekananda to make the students aware of his contribution in nation building. She told about his birth on January 12, 1863 in Calcutta; education and his works. He breathe his last on July 4, 1902 at the young age of 39. He was the founder of Ramakrishna Mission (1897), his often spoken quote was "Arise, Awake and Stop not till the goal is reached".

Dr. Poonam Sharma stated the literary works of this great monk on Bhakti Yoga, Karam Yoga, and the last Raj Yoga. She also explained through Swamiji's words about the importance of understanding our rich Indian culture in the face of rising westernization, which is eroding our culture with the help of an informative Power Point Presentation. Dr. Sharma also highlighted the difference between the character and reputation. She ended her speech with beautiful quotes written by Swami Vivekananda.

The people in community were aware of the SwacchbharatAbhiyan but were reluctant to take a lead and put the blame on the government and that there is no cleanliness in the basti. NSS volunteers talke to the men and women in the basti and gave them suggestions to keep the basti clean by throwing the litter in the designated place only and sweeping not just the home but also their surroundings for a clean and healthy community while following the swachhataabhiyaan!

Kalyanpura Government School 5 March 2016

88 NSS Volunteers went to the Kalyanpura Government School on 5th March 2016 as a part of the regular programme. The NSS volunteers divided themselves in groups of ten and went to classes. They interacted with students on one to one basis, in an effort to find out the academic issues that the students might have. Some students moved to the ground, where the students were playing games. In play-way method NSS volunteers tried installing values of health and hygiene. GUEST LECTURE ON HIV AIDS DR. PRADEEP CHAUDHARY, RSACS, JOINT DIRECTOR 11 March 2016

Dr. Pradeep Chaudhary, Joint Director (IEC) & APD (RSACS), from Rajasthan State AIDS Control Society, Jaipur delivered a lecture on HIV AIDS And Youth Vulnerability on 11th March 2016. He said that the youth of today, specially the women are highly vulnerable to HIV AIDS and that is why it is important to organize such a lecture in women's university. He shared the statistical figures which showed the growing menace of HIV in India, in Rajasthan and then in Jaipur which was alarming. He emphasized on the need for awareness and right information to prevent the onslaught of HIV. He discussed the modes of HIV transmission among the youth and warned the students to adopt protective measures such as use disposable syringes, use of condoms, and ensure the status of the blood donors. He also insisted on the students to strictly avoid multiple sex partners. He also shared actions that do not transmit HIV like hand-shake, or sharing a towel or soap etc, to develop sensitivity towards the affected population. This would avoid marginalization of the people infected with this syndrome and create a more humane approach towards them. He was accompanied by master trainer Mr. UmeshRautrey, who has been imparting awareness training at the grassroot levels. He shared the need to know the thoroughly about HIV and AIDS before going to create awareness. The session was informative for NSS Volunteers. 159 NSS Volunteers participated in the same

Awareness on Income Tax Return

27th February 2016

The Department of Accounting & Taxation organized a session on Awareness on Income Tax Return on 27th February, 2016. An awareness of Income tax is vital for the development of society. The objective of organizing the activity was to make the salaried employees aware about the various deductions and exemptions available to them under Income Tax Act. 15 students participated in the event. The faculty coordinators of the event were Dr.AnkitaChaturvedi(Coordinator),Head, Department of Accounting and Taxation & CA Priya Jain (Co-Coordinator), Assistant Professor, Department of Accounting and Taxation. The target group was the School Faculty of Govt. Sen. Sec. School, Vidhyadhar Nagar, Jaipur. The said programme was deliberated by a professional 'CA Apoorv Jain' along with the subject experts of this university and the student volunteers. The ITR Awareness Programme was started with a brief discussion of types of taxes, the fundamental aspect of income tax including taxable income, deduction exemption & tax rates. The information on filling ITR covering filling status, types of forms was also given and concluded with a discussion of tax planning strategies related to purchasing decision, investment alterative and retirement plans. Handouts were provided to school faculties on Slab Rate, Exemption and Deduction. Refreshments were provided during the session. The school faculties were delighted for having such a wholesome awareness programme. There was a query session at the end of the programme. Lots of queries were solved by the expert regarding the deductions and reductions in tax. The activity turned to be a successful one.



E-Filling of Income Tax Returns

(17th March, 2016)

An activity of Online filing of Income Tax Returns was organised on 17th March, 2016 in Computer Lab "A" at the IIS University, Jaipur by the Department of Accounting & Taxation. The target group for the activity was Final year students of B.Com (Hons) and B.Com (Hons) (Prof. CA). A total of forty-three students with individual PAN CARDS participated in the activity. The extension activity aimed at giving practical hands on training and exposure to students regarding filling of online ITRs. CA PrateekGoyal from M/s VinodSinghal And Company, Chartered Accountants, was called to conduct the one day workshop on E-filling of Income Tax Returns. The activity proved very useful for the participants as they had a practical exposure of filling income tax returns online.



Traffic Rules : Kabhi Na Jaana Bhool 27th February 2016

Creating awareness among people on traffic rules is essential to minimise the number of road accidents in our city. For this anextension activity was organised by the Department of Financial Studies on 27th February 2016, namley,"Traffic Rules: Kabhi Na jaana Bhool". It was an awareness activity in which 18 students made the people responsive towards the road safety rules to be followed. Students first educated themselves regarding the various road safety and traffic rules. Later on the students exhorted people to learn road rules and to strictly follow them in order to avoid accidents. They circulated the message that the number of road accidents would come down only when people adhered road rules strictly. The place chosen for the activity was the traffic light of SFS area in Mansarovar, jaipur. The students talked to the people about the importance of following the road lights, wearing helmet and seat belts. People of the area supported the students by listening to the students and following what was promoted by the students. To make a strong impact of this activity the students prepared the pamphlets, banners and stick-on which were distributed to the people on roads. The banners and pamphlets contained the driving rules and meaning of different road signals. 34 students participated in the event. This helped the students to spread the message prominently. The enthusiasm of the students for the activity was elevated and they spread the message to as many people as they could.


Financial Literacy: Gain for BPL Group 26th February 2016

The need for financial literacy is a prerequisite for financial inclusion in our country. The greatest bang-for-the-buck is when financial literacy programs are targeted towards households that are uneducated or financially illiterate. Careful attention should be paid to targeting financial literacy programs towards such populations. In order to promote it an extension activity was organised by the Department of Financial Studies on 26th February 2016," Financial Literacy: Gain for BPL Group". Under this activity, the students were made aware of the various banking schemes and programs of the Government like the Jan-Dhan-Yojana, Bhamasha Yojana and kishori Suraksha Yojana. A senior bank official conducted a short lecture to deal with the queries of the students and to improve their understanding of the basic of opening a bank account. Banners, posters and a small skit were created to strengthen the impact of the message amongst the students. The kacchi basti of Dadabari, sanganer was selected for this awareness program. Students created pamphlets which had sufficient information of the basic requirements to open up an account. Students performed a small skit on the need for opening a bank account and its benefits amongst the BPL sector. The students also conducted personal conversations with the each people of the locality, listened to their problems and guided them to resolve it. The response of the people was positive and the people of the locality showed interest in opening bank accounts and asked students to guide them. 34 students enthusiasm for the activity was commendable and they took the contact details of the people to further the impact of this awareness program. 18 students participated in the activity.



Extension activity - Best out of Waste

28 - 29th March, 2016

Department of Biotechnology organized an extension activity on Best out of waste . Student volunteers convinced faculty and students to donate used wedding invitation cards. Dr. Payal Mehtani trained them to prepare envelopes from these cards. Once the cards were collected, then from 25 February -25 March 2016 volunteers prepared envelopes (gift cards) from these waste cards. On 28-29 March 2016, the students set up a counter outside D-block in the university campus and sold these envelopes. An amount of Rs. 4020 was collected out of selling envelopes. The students along with Dr. Payal Mehtani and Dr. Charu Sharma visited two NGOs i.e. NayaSavera and Mother Teresa Home on 29 March 2016. The money collected was equally donated to both the NGO's.

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From this activity the students learned the waste management in an interesting way and also taught the same to other students and faculty. This would help them to reuse the wedding cards at their homes also. A feeling of social responsibility was inculcated in the students when they interacted with the members of both the NGO's. They also learned that their small effort can be of great help to such people who really need love and affection from all of us. Some of the students also decided to visit these places and help them regularly by devoting their time and fulfilling their requirements.



Extension activity - Helping Hands

28 - 29th March, 2016

Department of Biotechnology organized an extension activity named Helping Hands. Student volunteers convinced faculty and students to donate used clothes. All clothes collected were checked to ensure that they were not torn. Students washed the clothes (if received unwashed) and ironed them. Then they segregated the clothes according to different age groups and packed them. The clothes of children were donated to NGO NayaSavera and of adults to Mother Teresa Home on 29 March 2016. The students interacted with the care taker at Mother Teresa Home and enquired about the contributions they can make on their end to help the need. 20 students participated in the event.

Students were overwhelmed when they visited NayaSavera. They felt happy to contribute their bit to the society. They also asked if such activities can be conducted on a regular basis. Two students have even become the registered volunteers of NayaSavera and are working on different projects for the NGO.



A skill Empowerment: Knitting by hand

9-12th March, 2016

The Department of Fashion and Textile Technology, The IIS-University planned two day knitting activity on 09.03.16 and 12.03.16 from 10.30 am to 12.30 pm on skill development and income generation at Bhadarwas Basti, Mansarovar.

Eight student volunteers and one teacher coordinator- Ms.Lakshmi Agarwal form Department of Fashion and Textile Technology went as activity demonstrators.

The knitting activity was planned to impart the basic knowledge and skill needed for construction, accessorizing and ornamentation of household woolens like Caps, Sweaters, and Scarfs. The knitting skill imparted could be utilized for household consumption and also to generate income.

This activity was basically undertaken as it was simple and easy to grasp. The women folk especially the adolescent girls, who were not allowed to attend school, were targeted for the activity.Once the skill of knitting is learnt a product could be made in short span of time. Secondly, as the activity involves very minimal investment for materials, it could be used as reasonably good means to generate income with only time as investment.

It was observed that the adolescent and middle-aged female residents of Bhadarwas Basti Mansarovar, had ample time at their disposal which could be utilised for imparting the skill and product development, after they were done with their daily chores.

On 08.03.16 the activity coordinator went to the locale- Bhadarwas Basti, Mansarovar to organize and collect women for the extension activity scheduled for 09.03.16 and 12.03.16 for this purpose, the Head of Bastiwas contacted. With her consent, the Basti ground was finalized as the place for activity demonstration,

On first day of extension activity (09.03.16) twelve women residents and sixteen young girls assemble there to learn the knitting skill. The total target group was divided into eight groups. One volunteer from the Department of Fashion and Textile Technology were assigned to each group who demonstrated knitting skills to the female (adult/adolescent) residents. The three snitches demonstrated and taught to them were:

- 1) Casting the stitches
- 2) Knit Stitches
- 3) Purl Stitches

Although the first one hour was struggling, both for the demonstrators as well as the residents, eventually almost 50% women residents of the total target group enthusiastically learnt handing of needles and casting of the stitches and started practicing them.

On the second day of the extension activity on12.03.16 once the women folk got a hang of handing the knitting needles and casting of stitches, knit and purl stitches were taught to them. Concept of increasing and decreasing stitches was also demonstrated to them young girls were particularly quick in learning these techniques.

The woman residents (target group) appreciated the fact somehow; they could use their ideal time to knit woolens of functional use.

On the parting note, the residents were encouraged to knit length and width of the front of sweater and engaged themselves in completion of the back as well.



The activity had a very positive response. On the first day, twenty-eight women (adults and adolescents) residents willingly came and all of them eagerly learnt the art of knitting. once the length and width of sweater started taking shape, they gotlittle accustomed to the method and resident's enthusiasm gained momentum.

On the second day of demonstration, few more young girls from the Basti joined the group to learn the skill. By the end of the demonstration session the new group of girls was quick to handle the knitting needles, wool and stitches.

As winters had just gone by, most of the female residents knew the importance of woolens and wanted to learn hand knitting, so that in their leisure time they could engage

"Skill Empowerment Activity" (Beading Art) women's polytechnic college Pratap Nagar Jaipur

5th March 2016

The Department of Jewellery Design organized a Beading Art Workshop for Women's Polytechnic College, Pratap Nagar, Jaipur on 5th March, 2016. 30 students participated in the activity. Beadwork is the art or craft of attaching beads to one another by stringing them with a sewing needle or beading needle and thread or thin wire, Dot wire . Beads come in a variety of materials, shapes and sizes. Beads are used to create beautiful jewellery pieces i.e. necklace, earring, bracelet or other articles of personal adornment; they are also used in wall hangings and sculpture and many other artworks

The aim of this activity to increase the creativity among learners so that they can create their own fashionable jewellery and they can commercialized this beading art and open new boundaries for job seekers. They can start their own business with small capital and can give employments to others. Learner can get inspiration and sale their jewellery through internet. They can start their own work with small capital and can give employments to others.

During the activity, students got the opportunity to learn all the phases of jewellery beading and chose to make the beautiful pieces like necklace, bracelet and earrings etc according to their interest.

In the beginning session, Dr. Neeru Jain, Head, Department of Jewellery designing, IISU, introduced the students with the beading process, tools and materials. In practical sessions, students were involved with the planning and practice of techniques, types, size and colour combination of the beads as well as beading designs. They learned the technical skills including use of the various pliers, threading, knotting and stringing.

The feedback was positive. They participated enthusiastically & got the opportunity to learn all the phases of jewellery beading. They made the beautiful pieces of necklaces, bracelet and earrings etc according to their interest.







Skill Enhancement - Business Skills

23rd February, 2016

The department of management - HRM and IB of The IIS University organized an extension activity for the students of Government Higher Secondary school, Kalvanpura, on 23rd February 2016. The activity aimed to enhance the knowledge of the students regarding business plan. Students of MBA-HR participated in the activity. 5 students of semester four of MBA-HR along with Dr. Seema Singh Rathore and Dr. Purnima Sharma took initiative of visiting the school and imparting the business skills. The two hour session in the school covered a teaching session wherein students of 9th and 10th grade were taught all about business. The Speaker of the day was Mr. Sumit Saxena, Principal Consultant, Maven Quality Assurance Councel, Jaipur. Mr. Saxena startedhis lecture, wherein he discussed the various components of food and their relvence in our everyday life. Then, Mr. Saxena briefed the students about processing of various complex Food items used in the kitchen on a routine basis. He discussed, how labelling of processed foods should be checked in order to choose the best products available in the market and avoid various diseases caused by consuming wrong food items. He also discussed the various myths about kitchen cooking. In the end, a vote of thanks was extended to Mr. Saxena for sparing his valuable time and sharing his rich Industrial experience with the students and their relatives. 35 students and their relatives attended the session.



Dental Health and Hygiene Camp

They informed students about dental hygiene and personal hygiene. Tooth brushes and tooth pastes were distributed among 300 students. Interactive Session, on Struggle for Equality with Women on Wheels Drivers

26th February, 2016

Women Cell, Population Education Club and Centre for Women's Studies organized an interactive session on 'Struggle for Equality' on 26th February, 2016. Three women drivers trained by Azad Foundation and the Foundation team Ms. Anita Mathur, the Programme Officer and Mr. HariSharma, the placement officer came for the session. 100 students were present for the session. Dr. Raakhi Gupta, Registrar IIS University welcomed the group with potted plants from IIS nursery.

Through an interview of the women drivers conducted by media students, the students of Foundation Women's Studies from various disciplines got a glimpse of their hard earned confidence, the difference in their lives and their journey of acquiring commercial license. Ms. Mathur told the struggles the Foundation has with convincing women to take driving as a profession. Mr. Hari Sharma shared the interaction they have with boys in bringing about equal existence.

It was a learning experience for students and faculty alike. Ms. ChandaAsani, Lecturer Women's Studies presented mementos to the team. Vote of thanks was given by Ms. Aditi Lakhotia.

Gender Sensitization sessions for MBA students 18 August – 7 Sept. 2015

Gender Sensitization sessions were conducted for MBA students by the Womens cell of the University. 50 students participated in the sessions. Index cards were given to write what students considered about gender for 5 minutes in the first session. Ms. Asani shared that she was teaching Women's Studies here and Women's Studies is study of structures from underprivileged perspective. She continued that there were layers and layers of gender and would address beauty that day. What we saw in mirror was only reflection which too cannot be seen in absence of light. Invariably people tend to see only flaws when they look into mirrors. In TV we see advertisements only for fair and lovely never black and beautiful. In matrimonial columns there are demands for fair convent educated homely girl not a single one asking for a dark beauty. Soap operas in TV are value laden about what beauty should be and form uniform parameters of beauty. Ms. Asani's grandmother did not allow her to see the mirror and since she grew up with people of all shades and shapes in her own family and got scope of considering people without taking appearance into the picture. Because she did not see mirror she did not develop insecurities as she thought only black was beautiful also did not get slotted due to appearances!

After getting stereotypical responses of what made personality she shared that a single characteristic did not make personality but good health is basic ingredient that makes us confident. Good health comes from balanced nutrition. Good health also is first criteria for beauty and for her only one. She asked students to increase their diet

slowly, basic foods, start brisk walks in parks and not see mirror for seven days, most difficult to accomplish! Changes that are complex need paths that are not taken!

Very few of the understanding of gender shared by the students addressed social construction as gender. Mostly being male and/or female and related attributes wasseen as gender.

Gender Sensitization Session with Ms. Meenakshi Bhanjdeo 24 August 2015

An interaction session was organized by Women'S Cell on 24 August 2015 in AV Hall. Ms. Meenakshi Bhanjdeo, Director, Pravah Initiative, Jaipur interacted with 50 students as an expert . Ms. Bhanjdeo shred her experiences and talked about the aspects of day to day discrimination and stereotypical assumptions of what men andwomen absorb and accept as final. Students of Sociology and Women's Studiesparticipated in the session. Ms. Chanda Asani also interacted and asked the studentswhat they considered gender as, and asked them to write in five minutes. After that she proceeded to share gender issues related to beauty, menstrual health, History andreligion. Around 50 students participated in the session.
