National Conference on The role of Theatre in Education: past, present and road ahead

3-4th April 2017

In the recent times the relevance of theatre arts as an academic discipline in our society and the place of educational drama in nurturing individuals potential among youngsters has increased. With the aim to state the importance of theatre in field of education, The IIS university under the aegis of **the IISU Theatrical Society organized a two days National conference from 3-4 April 2017 on "The role of Theatre in Education : past, present and road ahead"**. The focus of the conference was to provide an opportunity to research scholars, students and teachers to exchange and share their experiences about the success of theatre, positive role that theatre can play in education.



Day1.3april2017, commenced with inaugural ceremony by lamp lighting by dignitaries followed by saraswativandana. Guest of honour in the ceremony was Professor Robin Das, eminent theatre director and actor and chief guest was **MsMitaVashisht eminent theatre artist and bollywood actor. W**elcome address was delivered by the Vice Chancellor Dr. Ashok Gupta. The aims and objectives of the conference were introduced

by Dr. Aditi RKhandelwal, Conference Convener. Guest of honour professor Robin Das shared his experience about how theatre can play an eminent role in educating students.

The inaugural keynote address was delivered by **MsMitaVashisht**. She enlightened the participants about the role of theatre, identity of self, voice and emphasized that "theatre is itself education". The kernel of her address was the role of theatre and its technique to discover self and how she emancipated women sex workers through performance in theatre. Dr. Raakhi Gupta, Registrar The IIS University proposed a formal vote of thanks in the ceremony.

The inaugural session was followed by two technical sessions. The first technical session was a panel discussion based on the theme "Social and Cultural aspects of Theatre in Education". The session was coordinated by **Dr. Ameeta Sharma and moderated by Mr. Kuljeet Singh.** The panellists in the session were Professor Robin Das, Professor SunitTandon and Mr. K G Krishnamurthy.

Professor Robin Das spoke on "theatre and culture" and introduced the rural context of theatre. He spoke about children's theatre and how the role of theatre in curriculum is limited. Mr. K G Krishnamurthy discussed about the new experiments in theatre. He enlightened the audience about performance oriented and process oriented theatre. He said theatre helps children to evolve socially.

Professor SunitTandon shared his experience about working in college theatre groups and how TIE plays a role in fighting stage fear and rediscovering self. It also creates cultural awareness and helps to develop leadership skills. The panel discussion was very fruitful and vividly brought forth the significant role of theatre in socio political and cultural aspects of life.

The second technical session was on "The Role of theatre in education for promoting regional theatre". The session **was co-ordinated by Ms. Abhishikha Joshi and was chaired by Mr. Shiva Tummu,** Theatre director and actor, faculty, Department of Drama, University of Rajasthan. The session had two speakers Professor Robin Das and Shri K.G Krishnamurthy. The session began with the introduction of both speakers by the

chairperson. The first speaker, Professor Robin Das talked about modern theatre and also about creative satisfaction. He also emphasized that uncertainty is the essence of drama and concluded by depicting inclusive nature of theatre which accommodates the refined and the raw, the professionals and the amateurs.

Shri K G Krishnamurthy while giving his interpretation of "Theatre in Education", talked about giving a theatre experience to the students in the process of learning, he called teaching- a process of explaining the subtext instead of the text. He also highlighted theatre as being a process and not a product. He concluded by signifying theatre as a medium to solve various socio-cultural problems. The session concluded with 15 paper presentations by the participants.

Day 2 started with the third technical session chaired by Dr. Archana Srivastava, theatre director, head, department of drama, University of Rajasthan and coordinated by Ms. Meha Saxena. The chairperson introduced the speakers. Session had two speakers Mr Sanjay Kumar, associate professor and artistic director, department of English, Hansrajcollege and Mr. Arvind Gaur, director and founder, Asmita group. The session was on 'Theatre as a catalyst in public movements'

Mr Sanjay Kumar mainly focused on the case study he did on 'NITHARI' i.e the slums and tried to use theatre as a weapon for the upliftment of children who faced child abuse, organ theft, kidnapping, murders, rapes and other atrocities.

The second speaker Mr Arvind Gaur emphasized that "performance is the key to human experience". He also stated that contemporary theatre must be enriched with influential ideas of social change to explore its potential. He also briefed about the street plays he has performed under his theatre group 'asmita'.

Technical session IV started at 12:30 after short tea break. The session was on 'Theatre as a career – Prospects and Challenges'. **Professor Ravi Chaturvedi chaired the session and it was coordinated by Dr. VandanaSachdeva.** First speaker of the session was **Prof. Beena Agarwal, professor,** department of Sanskrit, dean, faculty of arts, University of Rajasthan. She spoke about 'NATYASHASTRA' as a complete book to reform education in all sections of the society . Previously education was limited to knowledge of Vedas and higher class, this particular text helped to educate the deprived women and less educated classes and is referred as the fifth Veda. This inseminated knowledge, culture, education, craft, yog, voice, rhythm and aesthetic sensitivity in the community.

The second speaker, professor **Asha Pandey**, retired professor, department of European languages, literature and culture studies, University of Rajasthan spoke about meaning of 'natak' which means expression and action. She also stated that theatre has served and touched many lives as a concise keeper and an agent of change as well as instigator of protest against injustice perpetuated by state. She also stated that Theatre played a pertinent role in French Revolution as well the Indian Freedom Movement. Session concluded with 23 paper presentations by the participants.

In all 30 faculty members, 125students and 30 research scholars shared their research work through oral paper presentations on both days. The presentations were evaluated by the judges Mr Kuljeet Singh and Prof. Beena Agarwal.

3 Best oral paper presentations were also awarded.

Awareness on Income Tax Return 25th February 2017

The Department of Accounting & Taxation organized a session on Awareness on Income Tax Return on 27th February, 2016. An awareness of Income tax is vital for the development of society. The objective of organizing the activity was to make the salaried employees aware about the various deductions and exemptions available to them under Income Tax Act. 12 students participated in the event. The faculty coordinators of the event were Dr.AnkitaChaturvedi(Coordinator),Head, Department of Accounting and Taxation&CA Shruti Sharma (Co-Coordinator), Assistant Professor, Department of Accounting and Taxation. The target group was the School Faculty of Govt. Sen. Sec. School, Harmada, Jaipur. The said programme was deliberated by a professional 'CA Shruti Sharma' along with the subject experts of this university and the student volunteers. The ITR Awareness Programme was started with a brief discussion of types of taxes, the fundamental aspect of income tax including taxable income, deduction exemption & tax rates. The information on filling ITR covering filling status, types of forms was also given and concluded with a discussion of tax planning strategies related to purchasing decision, investment alterative and retirement plans. Handouts were provided to school faculties on Slab Rate, Exemption and Deduction.Refreshments were provided during the session. The school faculties were delighted for having such a wholesome awareness programme. There was a query session at the end of the programme. Lots of queries were solved by the expert regarding the deductions and reductions in tax. The activity turned to be a successful one.





Awareness on Right to Information and Consumer Protection Act 27th March 2017

A session on Awareness on Right to Information and Consumer Protection Act was organized by the Department of Business Studies of The IIS University involving 5 students and 2 Faculty Coordinators.

An awareness of consumer rights and right to information is vital for the development of society. The objective of organising lecture was to make the students of the school aware about the rights which are available to the citizens of India as consumers. The lecture was completed in two sessions. In the first session students of classes IX and X were acquainted with basics of consumer rights.

Second session was conducted for students of classes XI and XII of GVM Senior Secondary School, Malviya Nagar Jaipur, wherein they were told about Right to Information as well as Consumer Rights. Handouts were provided to students.

The activity gathered overwhelming response from the students and they were acquainted with the essential aspects of this landmark act.

Financial E-literacy 3rd March 2017

An extension activty was organised by the department of financial studies on 3rd March 2017, Dadabadi Basti, sanganer Jaipur. 35 Students of Financial Studies, Semester six and four made an active participation. The main objective of the activity was to create awareness amongst the residents of the basti about the major financial transactional changes taking place in the society in the realm ofdemonatization and advent of ebanking and mobile banking. Students made a thorugh presence in the basti by spreading the message through a nukkad natak on demonatization. Reaching out to the grassroot level and practically implementing the concepts, understanding the problems and issues of the people made the students understand the challenges of financial inclusion implementation in the country. They interacted with the residents of the basti and explained them the procedures of connecting their bank account with the mobile phones, usage of paytm, opening of bank account etc. The students also heared their general issues related to finances and saving and gave applicable suggestions. The activity turned out to be a successful event with the help of the major coordinators of the activity, Dr. Ruchi Jain, Dr.Anju Singh and Ms. Daksha Pathak.





Milk Testing Drive

Date: 24 March, 2017

Milk is the most common source of nutrition which is consumed on daily basis in every household. Adulterants if any, present in the milk can cause considerable damage to liver and kidney. In order to check the milk quality, a milk testing booth was set up in the campus outside the D-Block on 24 March, 2017. Students and faculty members were requested to bring milk raw (unboiled) milk samples (200 ml) consumed daily by them. A total of about 36 milk samples were tested which belonged to both pasteurized milk of regularly used brands like Amul, Lotus, Mother dairy, Gorus, Sarasetc as well as milk sold by local vendors of different areas. Students tested the presence of water, sucrose, starch, ammonium sulphate, acid, soap and formalin in the collected samples and generated report which was given to the participants on 25 March 2017. It was found that approximately 14% of the samples were containing residues of acid and about 6% contained formalin. Excess of water was found in about 20% of the samples. However, the presence of other adulterants was not detected in any of the samples collected. A total of 9 students participated in the event.





Generating awareness among Farmers regarding Harmful effect of Pesticides

Date: 22nd March 2017

A visit to a village Hajayawala, Sanganer, Jaipur was organized by the Department of Environmental Science& Eco-friendly Association of the IIS University on 22nd March 2017 as an extension activity for generating awareness amongst villagers regarding harmful effect of extensive use of pesticides, chemical fertilizers,textile wastewater for irrigation purposein agricultural fields andtheir effects on biotic and abiotic components of Environment.A group of 25 students and two faculty members of the department participated in the activity.

The major objective of the extension activity was to make aware the farmers about the ill effects of use of pesticides, chemical fertilizers and textile wastewater in the agricultural fields. Keeping this in view, the students of M.Sc(Environmental Science) delivered lectures and explained the technique of preparing compost and vermicompost utilizing their biodegradable waste from household and agriculture which would replace the chemical fertilizers preventing the loss of soil fertility to create awareness among farmers. Manufacturing the compost and vermicompost at large scale can be adopted as one of their occupations improving their economic status.

Students also prepared posters related to the subject to make the farmers understand things in a better way. They not only gave information about the harmful effects of use of pesticides, chemical fertilizers and textile wastewater but also shared the informationwith the villagers about the solution which they can adopt to reduce theireffects on environmental components, if alternate source of water is not available. A brief session on the various government schemes offered for the farmers were also discussed during the session. The farmers were found to be enthusiastic about the sessions. This awareness program was found to be informative and knowledgeable for the villagers.





Value Addition Techniques work(appliqué craft techniquesand product development)

24-25th August, 2016

The Department of Fashion and Textile Technology organized a two day Community Outreach Programme at Bhatta Basti, Shastri Nagar, Jaipur where 20 students volunteered with two teacher coordinators, Ms. Aditi Singh and Ms Yogita Joshi on Skill Development for income generation.

On 24th August 2016 students from Fashion and Textile Department with their cocoordinator left The IIS University for Bhatta Basti, Shasrti Nagar Jaipur. The organization had recently upgraded their unit and thus required assistance in learning new skill to help the associated women to earn a sustainable income.

The student volunteers were divided into five groups who trained the women participatants in different areas of the programme. Following were the five groups finalized for the activity:

- Shibori and Tie Dye Techniques
- Smocking for cushion covers
- Stencil printing and hand painting on home textiles
- Screen making and printing
- Embroidery: Sindhi Kadai

35 women participated, under the supervision of MsKomal Srivastava, Owner and Founder, Ms Sindhu, Unit In-charge and Ms Anna Troupe, Designer from their U.S. Collaboration, and were divided into groups of five to six women according to their area of expertise and interest. On the second day of activity, 3rd September 2016 the ladies at the basti had rearranged themselves in different groups so that they could participate in other activities that were being conducted by the students and coordinators at the unit.

The Programme started with a warm welcome and formal introduction from both sides. The students gave a brief idea of the different activities and started imparting the skills to the participants.

Six student participants were involved in training the basti women at Hunar in the technique of shibori tying and dyeing. The ladies were well versed in the art of Bandej tying but the concept of shibori was very new to them. Student designed two stoles and few samples with different motifs and tying techniques on basic cotton fabric. They also taught the women, dyeing of cotton fabric using direct dyes and common salt which they

could perform easily at their own homes. The activity was well received by the women and they found it very educational and useful for future product development. The students made sure to engage the women in the whole process and asked the women to design by combining the different shibori tying techniques for product development.

Five students were involved in training the basti ladies in different techniques of smocking. Students designed two cushion covers and three samples with different smocking patterns. The women of the organization found the smocking technique new and useful for designing cushion covers with easily available fabrics. They even tried making their own samples on fabrics that were available at the workshop. Two students from the department were trained in sindhikadai and were asked to teach the same to the interested women of the basti.

Five students were assigned to train the Hunar women in stencil making and painting using fabric colors. The students explained to them the use of stencil to create a variety of designs on home textiles as well as on garments. They also explained to them how one design could be divided into two to three stencils depending on the number of colors and intricacies of the design. They talked about the different methods of stencil painting and also showed the women to create designs using innate objects of nature like a leaf.

The whole process was very well received and appreciated by Ms. Komal Srivastava and her team at the organization Hunar. They felt that students volunteers had managed to train the basti women in areas that could be easily taken up by them at their home level and could now broaden their portfolio and also at the same time the organization's portfolio. They expressed their gratitude and thanks to all the students who had volunteered for the programme and discussed endeavors and excellent side events that could be carried out between both institutions in future

Pouches from waste material 01st& 02nd March ,2017

The Department of Fashion and Textile Technology organized an extension activity on 1st and 2nd March 2017, to BhadarwasBasti, Mansarovar, Jaipur. The coordinators were Ms. Poorvi Agarwal, Assistant Professor and Ms. Shalu Sharma. They were accompanied by a group of nine students from B.Sc. Fashion Design II Semester & B.Sc. Fashion Technology IV Semester .

Bhadrawas is a slum built by the Banjara tribe who had migrated from Jodhpur many years ago.



The students collected all the ladies and children of the slum under a shed. The motive of the activity was to up skill the tribe to make bags, pouches, comb pouches, potli bags, etc. out of rags. First of all, the students demonstrated making of sling bags with cardboard and pieces of fabric. The women showed keen interest and shared their skills. The women reported they knew basic hand stitching and embroidery and they would also make bags for their personal use.

The other products were an envelope pouch made out of paper and rags. The women asked for the material and promised that they will also try and make those bags. Students had distributed biscuits and chocolates to the children.

The materials used for the activity was charts, poster and Nukkad play was conducted. The charts were on core skills, definition and concept of life skill education. The adolescents were given knowledge about decision making skills.

The activity was conducted in four phases:

- a) Introduction on LSE
- b) Nukkad play
- c) Game on listening skills
- d) Interaction with adolescents

The activity began with the introduction on the life skill education given by MSc HSc (HD) students. The activity started at 11:00 am with the Welcome address by Nisha (MSc HSc (HD) IIth Semester) to all the adolescents of school. Around 75students participated in the activity

Then students of MSc HSc (Human Development) conducted the dramatic play on decision making. The students through play convey the message that decision making is an important part of the personality and it should be taken after using thinking skills. The play was for half an hour. All the students enjoyed it thoroughly.

Then to enhance communication skills the students planned a game on listening skills. The same sentence was communicated in the group of 10 students and response of the last student was listened. The meaning of the sentence was changed completely when it reaches to the last student. Then the students were explained the importance of listening i.e. first listen then speak. The activity was enjoyed fully by the adolescents.

Then in last, students explained them about the possible outcome of the life skill education. If the teen learn the skills, they will have enhanced self esteem, assertiveness, social sensitivity, listening, communication skills and ability to plan and set goals. These all the skills are important for the personality development of the teen. The aim to acquaint insight the life skill education was achieved successfully. 9 students participated in the activity.

They learnt here Indian values. The only drawback was that the University was being run in a college campus. Smt. Suman Sharma started her inaugural speech with gratefulness to be able to speak in a University for first time. She started her term in RSCW with breaking some myths. Girls have started going to police station but are unaware of their constitutional rights and the Sections in which they have to report. Because of that ignorance she decided to create awareness among women by organizing legal awareness camps. She expressed that although law is very boring but to create awareness she had to study it. She stressed that girls should know the importance of various sections of 354 of IPC. She shared a booklet that had all women related laws. She informed that the English version of the booklet is under publication.

Dr. Pramila Sanjay, Focal person of UNGCNI, made a lively presentation with the help of PPT about some aspects of the laws and constitutional rights related to women. She emphasized that girls should be aware of good touch and bad touch and should not feel guilty or afraid. They should ensure that FIR should be on green paper, they should read the signed FIR, edit it if required, take a photo immediately and get it printed. There is FIR also for against those not willing to take FIR. Dr. Raakhi Gupta, Registrar, The IIS University, Jaipur delivered the vote of thanks.

100 students of UG and PG participated enthusiastically in the camp and raised several questions related to laws and exercise of their rights.
