- 3. The volunteers were asked to share innovative and workable ideas on the basis of challenges faced by them personally in implementation of activities.
- 4. Especially literacy project running in different schools adopted by each group was discussed and new ideas for improving the academic outcome of students were included in the planning.





Tree Plantation

Though it is mandatory to choose one of the extracurricular activities in the I Semand most of the students join NSS in the very first year itself, they can volunteer to join NSS in Sem III as well. But as they doo not attend the Orientation programme meant for I year students, these volunteers who joined the NSS wing in their III Semester, weren't aware about the activities and requirements of an NSS volunteer and with the procedure to become a group leader. Thus, Dr. SharadRathore, Programme Officer, NSS Unit I of IIS (Deemed to be University) oriented 300 such students and discussedthe various aspects of NSS with them.

Guest Lecture on Gender Sensitisation

6 August, 2018

198 NSS volunteers attended a session on gender sensitization on sexual harassment. The session was organised on 6th August 2018. The session was initiated with a PPT presentation in order to create better understanding of gender discrimination for the NSS volunteers. During the entire session, the facilitators from Armaan, an NGO discussed about the various ways in which sexual harassment takes place in the society, at homes and at workplace. They also encouraged the volunteers to stand against the sexual harassment through their personal experience. They suggested that the students could carry a pepper spray and use whenever faced with any such situation. The volunteers came to know about their rights and how they could fight against such malpractices with the help of law. The session also ignited the spirit ofself-esteem.



Inauguration of PM's SurajSarthibus

6 August, 2018

The another activity on the same day as launch of the YuvaVikasPrerak (YVP) SurajSarthi bus inaugurated on 6th August 2018 by chief minister of the state. The bus, with half a dozen digital hubs provides information about Raje government's social welfare schemes, reforms and achievements across the state. The bus is designed to encourage visitors, share and learn through platforms like VASUdev, VASU-Nomics, etc. It also provides all detailed information about schemes like Bhamashah Health, CM .CM Rajshree Scheme, Rajasthan Free Scooty Scheme for Girls, Milk in MDM programm etc. State finance commission chairperson JyotiKiran who conceived the idea of YVP She addressed the gathering and said youth participation in government is crucial for every democracy. 

On third day making of useful items from waste bottles took place. In this activity as to make the volunteers understood the concept of reducing waste by reusing it.




<u>Day 4</u>


Activity-Observing Swacchta Week

Day I: 04 Sept 2018

Games on Cleanliness in Government schools

Total NSS volunteers were divided into two groups and the first group started their Swachhata week organizing games for students in the campus of the government schools. The main objective to carry out this activity was to create awareness about the importance of cleanliness among the students and to make them responsible for keeping their surroundings clean. All the students participated enthusiastically along with the NSS volunteers. Prizes were also distributed to the winning team members.





Cleanliness Games in Haziyawala government Primary School

All the groups of NSS volunteers went to the community for household survey on cleanliness and hygiene. For this NSS volunteers had prepared a questionnaire covering all basic aspects of cleanliness. While conducting survey they also talked about the ways to keep their surroundings clean specially during rainy season as this is the most favorable season for breeding of mosquitoes.



Outcome: Our Little initiative could bring a grand smile on their faces and a sense of belongingness among lots ofchildren.







Cleaning of institution (2nd - 5th August)

As a part of SwachthaPakhwada 2018, cleaning of various classrooms, labs, libraries, auditorium, playgrounds, lawns and roads in and around the university was undertaken from 2nd to 5th August by the faculty members and students enthusiastically.

On 2nd of August168 NSS students participated in classroom cleaning. The activity was organized for one hour. All 168 students were divided into three groups. One group of 20 students were sent to Dadabadi Government school and there 6 classrooms were cleaned. Another group of 25 students went to Badmohanpura Government School. They cleaned 8 classrooms in that school. Primary school children cleaned the cupboards, shelves, windows, window panes, window grills etc. Rest of 123 students were distributed in small groups of three each and allotted 42 different classrooms of the university campus to clean. Cleaning and decorating of Boards and its immediate surroundings were done.

On the next day i.e 3rd August, playgrounds and roads were cleaned. 93 students participated in this activity and again they were divided into three groups. Two groups were sent to respective adopted schools to clean their playgrounds and roads around the school and one group was involved in cleaning university playgrounds. They also cleaned 3 roads around the University campus.

On 4th August two auditoriums and one lawn was cleaned in University campus. A total of 92 NSS volunteers participated in this activity. Aditya Hall and AV Hall were cleaned along with back-lawn of the campus.

On 5th August laboratories and libraries were cleaned by 95 NSS volunteers. They cleaned shelves, equipments and stacked books properly in the Library. Under this Swachh Bharat Abhiyan every nook and corner of library and laboratories were cleaned.



6th - 8th August 2018

During the period the NSS Volunteers visited the adopted slum and took up door to door campaign to make the local masses aware about the importance of cleanliness in their surroundings. On the 6thAugust,2018 as a part of the campaign the volunteered went in groups from door to door and discussed Open Defecation in the DadabariBasti, Sanganer and how can this area be madeODF Free slum. A big groupof volunteers went to Government Primary School, Dadabari and spread the awareness about the bad effects of open defecation to 100 students. Many families in the Basti already have toilets in their houses and are also making use of them. Still the mothers would send the little kids in the open for defecation, these mothers and the children were counselled for the same.

On the 7thAugust,2018 as a part of the campaign the volunteered discussed Open Defecation in Kalyanpura, Sanganer and also discussed how this area be made ODF Free. 400 students of the Government Middle School, Kalyanpura were made aware about the disadvantages of Open Defecation to the health as well as the environment. The NSS

Volunteers distributed the informative material that was procured from the Nagar Nigam Office like leaflets, handouts from the local agencies working in the fields.

On the 8th August General Cleanliness and Hygiene awareness was taken up by the volunteers through door to door contact in the two adopted areas.



9th - 10th August, 2018

Intensive cleaning of the adopted slum and village was taken up by the NSS Units on the 9th and 10th August,2018. Local residents were counselled to make optimum use of the dustbins in their homes as well as on the streets. The volunteers distributed recyclable polythene bags to the residents to collect the garbage of the entire day and dispose it off in the dust bins installed at different places. With the help of the pamphlets, the volunteers emphasized the use and significance of green and blue dustbins.

On the 10th August, the volunteers demonstrated the right way of washing the hands aftertoilet and before eating the food in the Government Schools at Dadabari and Kalyanpura, to observe hygiene and keep healthy.

11th - 13th August, 2018

NSS Units took up cleanliness in the community center, SFS, Agarwal Farm Mansarovar, which is located close to The IIS University campus on the 11th August. The volunteers were divided into groups of 10 and different areas of the center were allocated to them for cleaning. The same activity was taken up in the two adopted bastis on the 13th August. The residents were involved in the process of cleaning the public places like the Anganbadicentre in DadabariBasti.

14th August, 2018

The NSS Units went to their adopted areasie, Dadabari and Kalyanpuraand organized rallies there, by involving the school kids and the local people, which ended in a NukkadNatak on Swacchata. They made posters on Swacchata carrying messages of cleanliness and placards to create awareness in the masses. They also read out the slogansloudly, which was also repeated by the school students, which attracted the attention of people on the streets.


15th August, 2018

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan Workshop

10th August 2018

Regional workshop was organized at MPUAT, Udaipur on 10th August 2018 for west Zone (Rajasthan, Gujrat) regarding activities planning for Unnat Bharat Abhiyan for villages clusters adopted by participating institutes (PIs). Dr. Charu Jhamaria and Ms. Archana Kumari were deputed from the IIS, Deemed to be University, Jaipur to attend the one day workshop. Two students attended the workshop with them.

The workshop was attended by 50+ delegates from west zone. It was started during the early hours of 10th August 2018 with welcome address by Prof. Vijay Kumar, Professor at IIT Delhi, national coordinator UBA.

Program has been inaugurated with lamp lighting, university song and finally speech of the Chief Guest Dr U. S. Sharma, Hon'ble Vice – Chancellor, MPUAT, Udaipur was delivered. He spoke briefly about UBA1.0, UBA2.0 and how MPUAT is associated with UBA. He also assured all PIs to provide all kind of support from MPUAT, Udaipur in making UBA program successful.

After Chief Guest note, Prof Vijay Kumar introduced important features of Unnat Bharat Abhiyan, UBA 2.0, the purpose for workshop and topics to be covered in the workshop.

The topics discussed in the workshop were:

- Web portal and PI login
- Adoption of villages
- Financial Aids

UBA web portal was demonstrated by Shri Ritesh Singh, CEO, Eckovation. He discussed the purpose of web portal as spreading vision and mission, creating awareness and easy communication between stake holders.

Prof. Vivek Kumar, IIT Delhi represented framework for preparation of plan of action and Funding and convergence also elaborated his views on participatory rural appraisal (PRA) tools and techniques for situation analysis.

Gram Sabha at Mohana Village, Jaipur

15th August 2018

30 students of the University visited Mohana Village on 15th August 2018 along with two faculty members of the University. The purpose of the visit was to celebrate Independence day with them and to conduct Gram Sabha for understanding the problems faced by the locals and to try suggesting solutions for the same. The program started with Flag Hoising. After the Flag hoisting The Unnat Bharat team of two members Dr. Pragya Sharma and Ms. Chanda Asani interacted with people from the village. Villagers enthusiastically participated in the sabha and openly discussed their issues with the team.

Some of the major problems faced included shortage of water and water available was dirty.

The electricity was only given during the night which lead to many other issues of health as women work in filthy water for different kinds of agricultural work. They do not get electricity power at the time of planting seeds (bowaai). Mohana pond water, which is also a source for recharging wells, is filthy.

Water level was reducing. Nasik medicine (some kind of pesticide) is not available when required. The Primary Health Centre does not have a doctor coming nor does it have adequate facilities.

Plastic is a major issue which is not created by farmers but merchants. Animals suffer because of this plastic, water bodies are facing problem because of plastics. Health is being affected.

Solar plant would be a great help according to quite a few farmers.

PRA Exercise at Village Kot Zevar

29th August 2018

10 students of the University under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan visited KOT JEWAR village which comes in Dudu Tehsil, Jaipur. Kot Jewar population is 700 approx and consists of 300 houses. 300-350 people are engaged in Blue pottery work.

Main objective of the field visit was to observe and collect information of the village through Participatory Appraisal Technique.

PRA was done with the help of key respondents of the village ,one was Lala Ram ji, told us that, he is the one who brought the concept of Blue Pottery in the village 25 years back and taught blue pottery art to villages and has been awarded by Vasundhra Raje.Lala Ram ji said he stayed in Germany for two months for workshop on Blue Pottery in which he taught blue pottery art to people and all the expenses were incurred by the government. Another key respondent was Sua lalji, President,of an NGO running for the welfare of artisans. Other participants were the people the village. Around 40-45 people participated. Following techniques were used to understand the condition of village. 1.Resource Mapping 2.Social Mapping

3.Transit walking4.Focussed group interview5.Wealth Mapping

While talking to villagers we came to know that main source of income of people of Kot Jewar is Blue Pottery and agriculture. Water comes from Bisalpur in Kot Jewar. Lala Ram ji helped us to locate all the resources of the village. We did resource mapping by using colours and chalks. Wealth mapping was done by using small stones. Focussed group interview was done on women, children of various age groups, male members.

Following problems were identified:

Their main source of livelihood is blue pottery, but they are weak in technology.

Proper market is not available so they can't get proper amount for their product.

For agriculture proper water facility is not available.

Backwardness of the community especially in field of health, sanitation and education. Condition becomes more severe when concern is about women community.

Village and Household Survey in the five villages adopted by the University under UBA

As per the Government directive, the University conducted a village and household survey in all the five villages adopted by the University under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan i.e Mohana, Nevta, RamjiPura, Jaisinghpura and Hasampura.

A team of 50 students each was sent to these villages under supervision of two faculty members for each team. Domestic Violence

4th September 2018

The Department of Home Science of the IIS University organized an extension activity on Domestic Violence on 4th Sept 2018 in Haziyawala community. The extension activity was organized by **Ms. Archanakumari**, Assistant Professor, Department of H.Sc, Human Development and 5 students of B.Sc (H) H.Sc Semester III.

The programme aimed at empowering women of urban slum to be aware and raise voice against the Domestic violence. The rationale of the activity is to create awareness about different types of domestic violence, Provisions under Domestic violence Act and to counsel them about how to deal with it.

The target group for this activity was women of Haziawala community. The reason behind selecting this particular section was that when the NSS team of IISU was conducting their activity, it was observed by the coordinator that many students are irregular. The principal of the school informed that she talked to their mother and got to know that fathers of most of the children have the habit of drinking and they abuse their children and wife on a regular basis. So because of disturbance in their domestic life they remain absent most of the days. So a urgent need was felt to conduct an extension activity in this area.

The activity was organized in the premises of Haziawala Government Primay school after taking the prior permission from the principal of the school. A total of 38 women of the community attended the activity.

The whole activity was planned in three steps namely, Presentation, Role Play and Interaction with women and their counseling. Materials were prepared accordingly like PPT, costumes, posters etc.

First a pictorial PPT was prepared to make the women aware about Domestic violence, provision of DV Act, procedure of filing complain, financial compensation and punishments. This was presented by all students in Hindi mixed with local language.

This was followed by a role play performed by all students depicting a women suffering from Domestic violence and how she deals with it. All the students participated in this role play.

Lastly an interactive and counseling session was held. Surprisingly women came out and shared their experience. One of the ladies spoke on how she protected her daughter from this social evil. She shared her whole story. While counseling one of the ladies revealed that she had complained once against her husband and as a result it was never repeated.

It was observed that the interactive session was very effective. Women interacted with students about their sufferings. Although most of them did not come out but their tears filled eyes were telling their stories. Many of them said that they are dependent on their head of the family so if they take step against them then, how will they rare their children. The students informed them about the compensation they will get from their husband and also advise them to empower themselves by becoming self-reliant. The activity was ended with a hope that one day they will raise their voice against this shameful act. In the end small refreshments were given to all the participants. i.e. samosa and tea.

Gender Role Perception

15th October 2018

The Department of Home Science of the IIS University organized an extension activity on Gender Role Perception on 15th October 2018 in IIS University campus. The extension activity was organized by Ms. Archanakumari, Assistant Professor, Department of H.Sc, Human Development and 5 students of B.Sc (H) H.Sc Semester III.

The programme aimed at dissemination the knowledge about prevalence of Gender defined Role in Indian society. It is evident in society that there are certain roles placed on boys and girls in accordance with their gender. These gender roles are imposed on children from birth and are taught until eventually they are accepted as absolute truth. Newborn babies are carried out of the hospital in either a pink blanket or a blue blanket depending on gender. Gifts of trucks or dolls are given to toddlers depending on the child's sex. Stories about princesses are read to little girls, while stories of dragons and swords are read to little boys. This socialization of gender roles is reinforced through the family, media, and education system. The rationale of the activity is to create awareness about stereotyped pattern of gender role and how society constructs these roles.

The target group for this activity was NSS students of the IIS University, Jaipur. The reason behind selecting this particular section was that youth of today have a wide range of ideas and orientations, even about issues as fundamental as gender. Among these ideas, differing ideas about gender can be very challenging, especially if a person hasn't thought about the issues of growing up male or female and how gender expectations affect day-to-day working relationships. This workshop invites students to think and dialogue on what gender role is and on their own attitudes toward it.

A total of 138 college girls from all the streams attended the activity.

The whole activity was planned in four steps namely, preparation of questionnaire on gender role perception, data collection, data analysis and discussion of result with NSS students. Materials were prepared accordingly.

Before conducting the activity preparation was done by semester III students of B Sc Home Science. A questionnaire containing 20 relevant items pertaining to gender role perception was constructed after a long discussion with the concerned faculty. It included items related to coming home late, household chores, participation in family decision making, clothing etc.

After preparation of the questionnaire data was collected from 60 unmarried (30 girls and 30 boys) and 60 people who were married since 5 years (30 women and 30 men). The collected data was tabulated and frequency was obtained through analysis.

Finally on 15th of October the result was discussed with all students. Each and every student participated in the presentation. It was quite an interactive session. As it was based on their day-to-day challenges they face so everyone could connect themselves with the findings.


Although we say that, society has been changing as far as gender role performance is concerned. There is no stereotyped role performance especially in an egalitarian middle class society where both man and women are equally participating in economic activities. But the result of this discussion proved this perception wrong. Many of the students agreed that they are treated as equal to boys in many spheres but still they face discrimination in their day-to-day life. The survey result depicted that boys wish to be boys in almost all items asked to them except clothing as they do not have much variety to wear. Whereas girls wished to be live like boys in many cases such as going out of hometown for studies, coming home late in the evening and so on. At the end of the activity it was requested to the students for putting efforts in changing the present scenario, as only youth has the potential to bring change in the mindset of the society.

Role of Calcium and Vitamin D for Bone Health 5th February 2019

The extension activity was organized by the Department of Home Science on "Role of Calcium and Vitamin D for Bone Health "for the senior citizens of SFS, sector 1 to 6 Mansarovar , Agarwal Farm Jaipur. The programme was organized at Senior Citizen Forum on 5th under the supervision of Prof. Ila Joshi , Ms. IshaSukhwal . Total 10 senior citizens attended the programme.

The main objectives of the programme were-

- To provide information about present statistics of elderly population worldwide and in India.
- To focus on the various health problems related to deficiency of calcium and vitamin D
- To enlighten their knowledge on diet during old age with regard calcium and vitamin D.
- To motivate people to lead a healthy life by performing light physical activity, yoga, meditation and brisk walking.

- Dietary pattern to be followed during old age specially calcium and vitamin D rich sources.
- Demonstration on light exercises, yoga and meditation

After the presentation, question answer session was organized, in which the queries of the participants were solved by the students and faculty.

Handouts were distributed, which contained information on various sources of calcium and vitamin D.

The session proved to be very fruitful and has enlightened their knowledge They also appreciated the efforts put in by the students of Home Science department. They interacted with the senior citizens present in the session and provided information beneficial to them. In the end they shared their own experiences and invited the students for the presentation in other organization also, such as Lion's club.

They also suggested to organize this type of awareness programme on different diseases like hypertension, cardio vascular diseases and other chronic diseases.

In the end the President of Senior Citizen Forum Mr. R.K. Agarwal delivered vote of thanks and ensured his cooperation whenever needed in future endeavours.

Last, but not the least, the programme turned out to be very interesting and knowledgeable for the participants, as well as it provided a platform to the students to work for good cause and serve the society. It created enthusiasm among students and provided them exposure and gave them confidence, by sharing their knowledge . All the students worked hard with complete dedication.

University UBA Committee


18 March, 2019

She slowly steered the girls through honestly interacting session by sharing personal experience for understanding gendered knowledge making constantly bringing Constitution of India. Even though the session was for adolescent school girls, it was enriching for University girls and faculty, as KamlaBhasin is candid in her sharing and she goes beyond books to bring out the nuances of gender constructions of society.

Screening of Ted Talk

A Ted Talk was screened for Foundation Women's Studies students. The Ted Talk by KamlaBhasin is titled 'Patriarchy Dehumanizes Men'! The 18 minutes Ted Talk is an attempt to make students see how gender not only constraints men but it also dehumanizes them. It banishes the idea that that patriarchy only oppresses women. It does not allow scope for men to express emotions which leads to unexpected violent ruptures. The Ted Talk was done in either coed college or only male students! As the audience is not visible it is only through Bhasin's addressing of the audience this assumption can be made and the acceptance of audience can be heard by cheers. Her quoting of WHO about the missing girls brings forth the gender perspective to both genders!



Students were asked to write what they would do to bring change in the patriarchal system. Bhasin and her brothers celebrated Raakhi by tying it on each others hand, brothers and sisters together lit the pyre of their mother, such examples gave an insight how practical possible changes could bring equality. 50 students attended the session.

International Women's Day Programme - Poster Exhibition

7-8 March 2019

Jointly organized by Women's Cell, Centre for Women's Studies, Gender Champion Club and NSS

On the occasion of International Women's Day Poster making competition was organized. More than 100 posters were exhibited for 2 days in campus as part of celebrating International Women's Day. It is a pleasure to see the creativity of students when posed with something as unexpected. Few students took help from internet, few brought out the obvious selection, some make attempts at trying something new and some create extraordinary expressions, altogether making each year worth waiting for their creative upsurge.



The students who came to see are wonderstruck by the concepts. Students from different departments and NSS volunteers came to see the exhibition. Women's Studies elective students tried to evaluate the posters. Journalism and Mass communication students saw it from their perspective.



Session on Women's Health Awareness

8 March 2019

Women's Health is an integral part of social existence which neither gets addressed by the society, nor women themselves. Women's health is taken as Unit in Foundation Women's Studies. For International Women's Day a session about Women's Health was organized in IIS Campus for students of the University. Dr Shweta Gupta, a Gynecologist had an interactive session with the students sharing a few aspects of women's health. 50 students participated in it.



Breaking taboos about menstruation she candidly took the students into confidence to share their personal sexual issues with their family doctor. Not go to strangers and to not delay such issues. The medical fraternity has had to deal with teenage pregnancies. She did not want to divulge the enormity of it but her concern and safety of college going girls was obvious when she insisted that they should take precaution and urge partners to take precaution too. She further shared about Cancers prevalent in women many of which can be avoided with preliminary tests. Even being a Gynic her approach was more of prevention and social health for developing healthy womanhood. It was an enriching session for the girls on the path to adulthood, an apt session for celebrating International Women's Day.

Health Camp for Women (BP, Sugar and Hemoglobin) in collaboration with SDMH Jaipur 8thMarch 2019

A Free Health Camp for students, faculty and non teaching staff was organized in the campus to celebrate International Women's Day. 50 NSS volunteers pitched in for the registration and smooth conduction of the camp. There was overwhelming response of students and staff. SDMH had arranged for 250 testing of hemoglobin which got used.

Gender Sensitization on Sexual Harassment

6thAugust 2018

Collaborative effort of Department of Commerce and Management and Centre for Women's Studies, Women's Cell, Gender Club and Population Education Club

Team Armaan has been associated with theIIS (deemed to be) University for past four years to do session with students about creating awareness towards sexual harassment. Their motto is Respecther, i.e., respect the other. Students of Management studies and Women's studies participated in the session.



100 students were present for the session. The session commenced with screening of a very powerful video which talked about assault, harassment and it's reportage. This was followed by a round of questions asked by them, viz, "Have any of you been harassed

from verbal to any physical way?" Lots of hands were raised. "Do you think anyone from your family could be a potential rapist?" Only three hands went up. A potential rapist is someone who has the ability to rape someone which starts with ignored sexual harassment.

The speaker then talked about the power of standing up and fighting for your rights. Lastly, few incidents were shared, questions were discussed, some startling facts discovered. The fact that the Shipra Path police officials are willing to set up an office near to the college, they just don't have enough number of complaints to be put down onpaper. They said that only two cases have been filed in three years and harassment is a daily issue, they are aware of that. Speed dial numbers were set up, police stations numbers were given, were informed about the statements in IPC against harassment andsexual assault. The session was so interesting that none of the students wished to leave.

The session was not only an awareness session on sexual harassment and available protective legal provisions but it was also an effort to change outlook to overcome fear and shame.

Gender Sensitization Sessions

14, 21 and 28 August 2018

Day 1 Ms. ChandaAsani did sessions with 100 management students for 3 days. First daywas introducing students to accepted concepts of beauty as considered in advertisements! The constructions of gender are so strong that the idea of questioning theadvertisements of fairness comes as a surprise to the young girls. They slowly acknowledge and accept the created insecurities and discrimination of beauty myths. Theappearance involves not just the colour but also how women speak and dress and their education also plays a part in this process of differentiation. The hierarchy inherent in this gendered process is difficult to perceive. The management jobs are paid higher thanothers, is also part of this system of gendered socialization.

Day 2 Women's menstrual health was taken up the second day. The purity and impurity notion is a major gender issue which creates young girls to have low self esteem. This is due the fact that menstrual cycle is monthly affair and when girls get initiated to this in their impressionable adolescence. Month after month, year after year the reproductive period coincides with the productive period in women's life. If menstruation is associated with impurity and women are not allowed to worship then they tend to feel inferior. Knowing that it is the same blood which enhances all humanity is an eye opener and provides space for change. Seeing menstruation as health criteria helps women to respect their bodies and take care of it accordingly.

Day 3 Women's representation in History was taken to further empowerment of girls. There are hardly any women in mainstream History. This is because there were hardly any queens and History is written about rulers! And the women who are written about in Indian History are mostly from upper caste and upper class can be counted on fingers. This again makes women feel that their work and worth is not good enough to be written about. Rewriting History has been done by Women's Studies scholars not just from academics of History but also feminist scholars from various other disciplines. This rewriting is making women visible to all. This rewriting also speaks about how women are represented in history as per patriarchal norms. One such example is Taj Mahal a tomb of Mumtaj Mahal, third wife of Shahjahan who died giving birth to her 14th child. History does not mention about Razia Sultan's tomb, the only queen of Delhi Sultanate, same religion but was given the kingdom in preference of her brothers as she was more capable. If antiquity is concerned as taken with Brahmanical texts considered more valid when older then Razia Sultan should have been more important in representation in History! That would be inspiration to women and men to diminish the gendered socialization.
