Tree Plantation Drive

15th July, 2019

On 15th July 2019 the NSS volunteers organized and successfully completed a tree plantation activity at Sanganer area, Jaipur under the "GO-GREEN DRIVE" initiative. Trees are the foremost source for producing the oxygen in environment, they helps to reduce the level of CO₂. As we all know that the whole world is facing the problem of global warming and to recover from such problem, planting trees has become one of the most important aspects today. Tree planting is grounded in forest science and if performed properly can result in the successful regeneration of a deforested area.

A group of 50 volunteers with faculty member reached the ground of the garden and were handed saplings to be planted. The event in-charge first briefed the students about the importance of tree plantation. Even the help staff demonstrated the whole process and gave the students all the know-how's on how to plant the trees and water the plants. The helpers told them about the importance of plants, their uses etc. Various types of saplings were planted by students and faculty of the university.

It offers a range of interventions, one of the most important being youth 'JUMBISH' annual youth festival organised to celebrate the spirit and potential of youth for social change. The guest lecture ended with a quote by Mahatma Gandhi - 'Be the change that you want to see in the world', and a momento was presented to Ashutosh sir.

9th August 2019

On 9th August 2019, posters were prepared by 135 volunteers related to cleanliness and hygiene with catchy slogans and pictures. Prepared posters were used in the program, some of the posters were pinned up on the different notice boards of campus as well as in faculty rooms, labs and even in classrooms. Creative posters prepared by the volunteers were pinned up in different faculty rooms around the campus. prepared posters on say NO to PLASTIC, not throwing garbage in the campus, using bins for the disposal of waste and keeping the camus clean and green. In their efforts of proliferating awareness, they also put up creative and persuasive posters at different corners of the university.





Swachta Campaign at IIS University Campus 5th August, 2019

A campus cleaning programme was organized by 100 NSS volunteers in the university campus with active participation of NSS volunteers dated 5th AUGUST 2019 Monday. The cleanliness tasks were divided amongst the sub groups. Volunteers were divided into groups and were allotted with classrooms, laboratories, library etc. where the NSS volunteers interacted with the students briefing them about the importance of cleanliness in classrooms. Volunteers picked wrappers and foils and bits of paper lying in classrooms and threw it in dustbin and helped arranging chairs. The main purpose of this program was to create awareness among the students regarding cleanliness and its benefits and not to use plastic bags or any form of plastic .To save electricity and to take a step forward in this campaign by cleaning their classrooms. Efforts were done by the volunteers to create awareness not just among the students but also the staff members. Volunteers even interacted with teachers and briefed them about the consequences of littering and the benefits of keeping our campus clean. Volunteers even briefed about the arrival of diseases due to unhealthy environment and also stressed on Hygienic environment as it aids in better learning. "Cleanliness is next to godliness"- with this mindset volunteers took the initiative to clean the university labs. So the volunteers visited geography lab, food science lab, textiles lab, chemistry lab, physics lab, and psychology lab. Activities ranged from cleaning the slabs and boards of the different labs which were covered in dust, volunteers even urged the students as well as faculty members to reduce their usage of electrical appliances, students were even briefed about the proper disposal of test tubes and even the importance of using clean and sterilized instruments to prevent the dangerous spread of germs. Our teacher coordinator motivated students towards 'Clean India' by his inspirational talk. The volunteers started cleaning the entire campus and collected all the litter for disposal. Some of the students were found using plastic bottles and straws so volunteers urged them and made them aware about the consequences of using plastic and also suggested them the alternatives of plastic while investigating the campus the students found a pile of plastic glasses, straws

and bottles around the canteen area so they requested the Janitors to clean it. The enthusiastic NSS volunteers devoted their time and energy to spread the message of cleanliness across the campus at multiple canteens and rest rooms. They visited the 'Planet J' canteen and picked up littered trash and used paper plates. They also stopped by the 'Amul' canteen and spread awareness about the importance of cleanliness and being plastic free. The volunteers even closely inspected the cleanliness of the rest rooms and volunteered to close leaking taps and even picked up some scattered trash. The project does not end here volunteers took an initiative to continue this project even outside the campus and be a helping hand towards the conservation of environment. The volunteers were instructed to clean their hands with soap at the end.





Orientation to National Digital Library by Dr. Sonal Jain

Problem Identification

Members of Jal Shakti team visited the Hasampura village on 2nd Sept 2019 to have an idea about the existing water conservation activities undertaken by the villagers, water related problem which they are facing and to formulate strategies to deal with those problems. One day before the visit Sarpanch was informed and he was requested to inform the villagers about the Jal Shakti team visit. Villagers were asked to gather at a common place and the activity started with a discussion on present status of water in the village. During the discussion the problems identified related towater are: There is an acute problem of water in the village and there is no alternate resource except Nevta bandh. The villagers did not just face problems with respect toirrigation for agriculture but also experienced difficulties in arranging water for day to day activities. The water level in the village had depleted alarmingly over the years.



Villagers were found to be aware about the water scarcity in their village and they are facing it too but surprisingly not doing anything for water conservation. Male complained that women at home waste water a lot but women did not agreed to their statement. Although they are informed about water scarcity in Rajasthan through different media sources but not taking any step to resolve this problem due to lack of self-realization. Only two-three households were found to have installed the system of water harvesting. No further step was taken to renovate the traditional water bodies like wells, ponds etc.

Constitution of "Gram Jal Shakti Team" in Hasampura

A Gram Jal Shakti team of total seven members were constituted in Hasampura village on 2nd Sept 2019. Two women and three women from the village and two faculty members of IIS (deemed to be university, Jaipur), Dr. Alka Kataria and Ms. Archana Kumari were included in the team. Approval of the village Sarpanch was taken for the Gram Jal Shakti Team.



Expert Talk on Water Conservation

On 4th Sept 2019 an expert talk was organized in Hasanpura village. The expert was Dr. Alka Kataria, Assistant professor in the Department of Environment Science. She

began her talk with importance of water and scarcity of it especially in Rajasthan. She said that water conservation should begin from home itself and teaching the future generation about the value of every drop of water should be practiced in each household. She suggested few measures for saving water and appealed especially to women present there to practice those strategies at their home. She talked about the depletion of groundwater level in the village and suggested the villagers to save rain water through the technique of rainwater harvesting. She also suggested few techniques to farmers for using and storing rainwater efficiently for irrigation in their farms. Tree plantation on a huge scale was also suggested by the expert.



Poster making on Efficiency in utilization of water

A poster making competition was organized in government school of Hasampura on 6th Sept 2019. The purpose to organize this competition was to make children aware about the ways they can adopt in their day-to-day life for saving water by using it efficiently. Before making the poster children were explained by the students of IIS (deemed to be University), Jaipur about how and when they generally waste water in their daily activities and how they can save water. It was very surprising to see that many students showed the ways of water being wasted in their surroundings through pictures or writing on paper.





On 9th Sept 2019 poster making competition on the same theme was organized in the IIS (deemed to be University), Jaipur campus. 46 students participated in this activity and prepared meaningful posters and pasted in every classroom.

Oath taking on water conservation

Students, teachers as well as non-teaching staff members of government school of Hasampura took a pledge to conserve water. The aim of this activity was to educate children on the importance of water and the need to plant saplings. Emphasizing on

the significance of water conservation, the faculty of IIS (deemed to be University), Jaipur and Principal of the school asserted that it was the need of the hour. The teachers advised the students to stop wasting water and motivate their family members, friends and other acquaintances to save it.





Slogan writing on "Ban use of Plastic"

The activity of Slogan writing on ban on single use plastic was organized in government school of Hasampura on 11th Sept 2019. To make the campus free from plastic it is very important to make the students aware about the harm to the environment caused by using plastic and encourage them to take initiatives in making their campus plastic free. Slogans on ban of single use plastic were written and displayed in each and every classroom by the students.

On 12th Sept 2019 slogan writting competition on the same theme was organized in the IIS (deemed to be University), Jaipur campus.



Distribution of bags for collection of plastics from households

During the visit it was found that plastic has created havoc in Hasampura as there is no facility of common dumping area. The whole village is littered with plastics. Faculties and students of IIS (deemed to be University), Jaipur tried to convince villagers for not throwing garbage in open areas but in the absence of garbage dumping area it cannot be possible. So as alternative villagers were given big plastic bags and were asked to dump their plastic waste in that bag so that the van from the university will come and collect the garbage once in a fortnight.



Documentary screening on "Ban use of Plastic"

On 14th sept 2019, documentary screening was done at Government School Hasanpura to promote ban on use of plastic.

Skit on Ban of single use plastic

Cattles roam the streets littered with garbage looking for food. As cows pick through piles of garbage, hunting for leftovers, they also consume plastic. Unsurprisingly, the biggest plastic pollutant digested by cows is plastic bags. The bits of plastic consumed build up in their internal organs, which make it difficult for cows to eat. As a result, milk production drops as does milk quality. Over time, the plastic consumption "sentences cattle to a slow and cruel death.

To sensitize the students towards this issue a skit was prepared and performed by students of government school under the guidance of students of IIS (deemed to be University), Jaipur in the school campus on 14th September 2019.





Documentary Screening on Ban of Single use of Plastic

DATE: 9th Sep, 2019

Plastic bags are everywhere in our environment. In our modern lives, they have become a part of us. However, the convenience of these plastic bags come at a very high cost to the environment and negatively affects human health. To raise awareness on the same, a documentary screening was organised for the students of D6-D10 of NSS on the topic of "Ban on the use of single use plastic". Three documentaries were screened for the students namely 'A plastic wave', 'India could ban 6 single-use plastic products from Oct 2' and 'What really happens to the plastic you throw away'. It was an eye opener for the students as most of them were not aware about the complexity of the situation.



Documentary screening on Mahatma: A great soul of 20th Century

September 16, 2019

364 volunteers of group A, B, C, D, E (6-10) attended the screening of the documentary on Mahatma – a great soul of 20th century for their NSS activity. The activity was held at the AV hall at 9:30 am. A short documentary was being played in which all the struggles faced and witnessed by our freedom fighter Mahatma Gandhi – 'The Father of the Nation' were shown.

All the movements which took place for the independence of our country and the particular cause behind all these movements were also informatively displayed. All the rights, policies which were removed and implemented by the Britishers were also discussed.

All the students found the documentary very informative and interesting. They all came to visualise the lives of their freedom fighters more closely and got to know more about the history and importance of which played the vital role in the independence of our country.



Literacy Project in Government Schools

9th September, 2019

The NSS volunteers went to 5 different government schools for the literacy project. There were 480 volunteers who took up the task to impart knowledge among the students by using innovative ideas related to education. The students made posters with the volunteers. As a part of the literacy project, 335 volunteers of NSS went to 5 government schools to share knowledge about Mahatma Gandhi's contribution as we mark the 150 years of his birthanniversary. The volunteers made the students write few lines about the father of the nation so that children can get exposed to India's most crucial part of the history and understand the impact that substantial leadership can have.



Short film screening on Gandhi

September 16,2019

Under Literacy project, 236 NSS volunteers went to various Government Schools for their NSS activity. Under the guidance of Ms. VyomaAgarwal, the students of the school were divided in groups. Each group was allotted one class and the volunteer taught them different topics like cleanliness of surroundings, traffic rules and animal cruelty, hygiene and healthy living, healthy eating and proper nutrition and screened a documentary on Mahatma Gandhi.

The main motives of the activity were to aware students about the little things which we tend to ignore and are important for the development of a little kid to a responsible citizen. The students were very happy to have an interactive session

filled with knowledge, joy and fun. For NSS volunteers the feeling of teaching students was rewarding.

The volunteers enthusiastically participated in the session and showed interest in attending the training sessions of self-defense.





Guest Lecture on Women's health and Check- up

January 13, 2020

A guest lecture was organised by NSS on 13th January, 2019 on the topic of 'women's health' together with medical check up for student as well as faculty of IIS (deemed to be University). A total of 371 NSS volunteers participated in the same. The guest speakers for the day were Dt. Manila Bhargava and Divya Gupta from B. Lal Path labs. Dr. Divya Gupta started with a brief introduction about the cervical cancer and how it affects the Indian women. She discussed the potential symptoms of cervical cancer and the basic diagnosis involved, including details about pap smearing. She further discussed about the available treatment options and the vaccines, i.e, gardasil and cervarix. The age-wise dosage and the need for routine medical check-up was also emphasised upon.

Later, Dt. Manila Bhargava spoke about the importance of a balanced diet and the ill effects of lack of nutrition in one's diet and the requirement of having atleast 3 full meals in a day.

The importance of having an adequate quantity of water and diet enriched with vitamins and minerals were also discussed. Towards the end, she spoke about the main constituents of a balanced diet like cereals, protein, carbs, oil, ghee, milk, fruits, vegetables etc. and debunked myths related to healthy diets which include fasting for a long stretch, strict fruit diet to name a few. The program ended with the presenting of the momentos to the guests followed by a health check up camp in the infirmary.









Women Empowerment through Self Defense Skill Camp

18-25th January, 2020

The NSS unit of IIS (deemed to be university) organized a seven days camp for Women empowerment through self defense in collaboration with Women cell of Jaipur Police for NSS volunteers of the university. The objective of this camp was to empower the girls by imparting them with self defense martial art skills. Self defense martial art skills training is specifically chosen to empower the girls so that they can protect themselves from mishappenings taking place with girls in society nowa days.

During the camp two women police officers have trained 150 girls. In order to empower the NSS volunteers of university with skill of martial art, to be used against wrong doers, they taught various techniques practically to the girls. They also presented various situation in front of girls like front rolling, back rolling, when someone push from back or front, etc. and taught them how to tackle in such adverse situation.

The seven day camp ended on 25th January 2020 in presence of DCP and IPS Preeti Jain, Additional DCP Sunita Meena and Inspector Mamta Shardul along with rector and faculties of university. In the valedictory session, DCP and IPS Preeti Jain addressed the gathering and quoted that martial art skills are insurance which will help girls to save in situation of difficulties. She focused on the fact that a girl should try to save herself on her own for first by making use of self defense techniques and then only look for legal help. Additional DCP Sunita Meena also addressed the girls and given them a message of not to be afraid of anyone. During valedictory session, NSS volunteers have demonstrated different tricks learned during the camp in front of dignitaries. All the volunteers trained in camp seemed to be full of strength and confidence after the camp.



Quiz: Road Safety

The NSS Department of IIS (deemed to be university) organised a guest lecture on 20th January, 2019 on the topic of 'road safety'. A resource person from Maruti Driving School was invited to take the session on road safety. The session was started with a brief introduction about road safety. NSS Special Camp

(26th Jan-1st Feb 2020)

Day 1:Inaugration of the Camp and Visit to Kushthashram

NSS Units of IIS (Deemed to be University) have organized a seven day Special Camp for NSS volunteers from January 26th to 1st February 2020. 150 students registered for the camp. The inauguration of the camp took place on Republic Day, January 26th, 2020. The ceremony commenced with Flag Hoisting by Dr. Ashok Gupta, Vice Chancellor, IIS (deemed to be University). After that, the NSS volunteers presented the NSS song and a patriotic group song which was sung by the Group Leaders of NSS. A Nukkad Natak highlighting the positive role of the three pillars of the government and the role of the responsible citizens in democracy was also presented by the NSS volunteers. The inaugural ceremony and Republic Day celebration came to an end with the blessings and words of wisdom by Dr. Ashok Gupta, Vice Chancellor, IIS (deemed to be University) who was the chief guest on this occasion.

The volunteers then visited the 'Manav Kushth Ashram' at Galta. It is a home and work place specially dedicated to leprosy patients. The NSS volunteers visited the whole ashram which comprise of work stations, temple, residential quarters, commonarea, chaupal, etc. The volunteers performed a skit on the role of responsible citizensin democracy. The volunteers interacted with the residents of the ashram ,and got aquainted with the challenges and the skills used by them for their livelihood. The ashram inmates shared their experience with the volunteers and thanked them for visiting. The ashram visit was followed by a visit to Bad Ka Balaji, a temple situated in front of the ashram.





Day 2: 27th Jan 2020

Yoga session and Orientation for Nukkad Natak:

The first day of the NSS camp started with the yoga session. The early morning yoga session helped the students to collect their energy and get prepared for the entire day camp. The students participated in the session with keen interested. After the yoga session the Mr Mohammad Ali oriented the students about the intricacies of Preparing the Nukkad Natak. The mentors gave an insight into the basic principles and guidelines to be taken care off while making an impactful creative Nukkad Natak. The students were further divided into small groups which then brainstormed the ideas of the Nukkan to be showcased at the end of the camp.



Projects in Schools and Umang:

33 Students of special NSS camp of Group A participated and visited Dadabari Government school. There they all covered different subjects using creative methods of teaching from class 1st to 5th. Sudents of class 1st and 2nd were taught rhymes using hands ,class 3rd and 4th were taught addition and subtraction using number line and also prepared for their maths exam and 5th class students were revised hindi chapters for exams. Similarly the 35 students of Group B went to Badmohanpura school with the project on environnement. NSS.. On day I students diliver a introductory session about environment pollution and their causes. In a week they are planning to arrange a documentary session, tree plantation and nukkad natak. Students of the school were excited for the whole week. 32 Volunteers of **Group** C went to Kalyanpura School with the project on stress management during examination. During the discussion, first they traced out the examination pattern followed in school. Thereafter they triedand find out students view point regarding stress before and during the examination. Volunteers have observed that there was a mixed response of students regarding stress but majority was found agreeing that they remain in stress during exam.12 volunteers of NSS Group D took the project cleanliness and hygiene and went to haziawala school . The project for students of **Group** E was on Learning Physiotherapy named "Finer and Motor Skills" for helping disabled children and learning how special children learn through these activities in special school. 26 NSS volunteers of Group-E visited the special school 'Umang' located in Kshipra Path, Mansarovar, Jaipur. To begin with the Chairperson of Umang Dr Deepak Kalra briefed them about the organisation Umang. Students have gone for a visit to the school; their classrooms and training rooms and also to the physiotherapy area. The volunteers worked into two groups; and gave them hands on learning assignment of physiotherapy named "Finer and Motor skills". In this assignment NSS volunteers will get a chance to interact with the students; and also will learn about the physiotherapy school gives to disabled students.



Interaction with Principals of Government schools on Issues and Challangesin Govt Schools

Dr. Suman Visth, Principle, Haziawala School, Jaipur and Dr. Jogender Singh Bugalia, HM, Hazialwala School, Jaipur were welcomed with a token of gratitude. Dr. Suman commenced the lecture with telling the students how NSS Volunteers have helped the schools and students to grow high with not only education but also their rights, which the volunteers of NSS have made them aware with the help of nukkad nataks and functions. Mr. Jogender shared the problems that they are facing in educating these children. Sir talked about how the children who come to the schools struggle to come to school but are very excited to learn. The session concluded with the experiences of NSS volunteers with the children of these schools.



Guest Lecture on how to make posters

Dr. Shwet Goyal, Associate Professor IIS (Deemed to be University) gave a knowledgeable and fulfilled lecture in NSS Special camp. The main aim of the session was to acquaint the students with the role of posters in human life since centuries. The speaker enlightened the students about the inclusion of posters in communication design and how they connect masses with one idea, by one caption or slogan. It was a mesmerizing lecture and the girls were glued to their seats listening to the lecture with all attention. Sir talked about different slogans used in posters to aware the citizens for various ideas like; "Youth chala polling booth", "Hum do, humaare do", "Chordo saare kaam kaaj, vote karne chalo aaj" and many beautiful slogans. The session was very knowledgeable and informative.



Day 3: 28th Jan 2020

Yoga Session: The second day of the NSS camp started with the yoga session. The session helps to warm up the body. Few small aasana are practiced in this session. Students are quite enthusiastic for the same.



Nukkad Natak: After the yoga session the Mr Mohammad Ali started teaching few skills of nukkadnatak. Students are divided in team and different themes are selected by them. Students started practicing their respective group theme.

Projects in School: Students of special NSS camp of Group A As a part of the project theme 'Creative Learning', volunteers went to Dadabari school to help them with their studies. The volunteers as per the activity plan took pulses and gram to enhance motor skills of the students and teach them tables using the same. The NSS volunteers divided themselves into groups and each group went to various classes for interacting with the students and teaching them through innovative ways. For all those students who find mathematics difficult to learn, it was truly a fun activity and since they have their exams going on ,it was really a productive exercise for them .The volunteers used certain games to teach students that could help them remember various kinds of nouns. As a part of the literacy project, volunteers assisted the students to revise their curriculum. Similarly the students of Group B went to Badmohanpura school with the project on environment. They showcased a short movie on environment pollution, students love to see that. Film is based on a child who worked for environment conservation with limited resources. Volunteers of Group C went to Kalyanpura School with the project on stress management during examination. On day 2 ,nss volunteers shared strategy to cope with stress during exams .by means of chart they made the students understand how they can distress them by practicing very small things like time management, taking balanced diet, etc. Volunteers of NSS Group **D** took the project cleanliness Three activities were undertaken: Drains cleaning, Paper bag making Poster making competition The drains in Hajiyawala are open andfilthy. So an effort was made to clean them and raise awareness about the same in the community. Drains were cleaned with the help of a sweeper, under the supervision of students. The school students were taught the method of preparing paper bags in order to discourage the use of plastic bags. They prepared two bags individually. Poster making competition was organised on the theme of "Environmental hygiene". The winners were given chocolates as a token of appreciation for their work. Students enjoyed the activities. Group E was on Learning Physiotherapy named "Finer and Motor Skills" for helping disabled children and learning how special children learn through these activities in special school. volunteers of Group-E visited the special school 'Umang' located in Kshipra Path, Mansarovar, Jaipur. With their brief orientation the previous day, students moved on to understand and learn the various

activities which they have to do with the special children in order to improve their finer and motor skills. There were 6 different activities involved which were related to development of sensation, perception, balance, etc., in special children. Thereafter, NSS volunteers were divided into groups of two and were monitoring the movement of every child in every activity. This was an enriching experience for all the NSS volunteers as they got to learn many complexities involved in such activities. They were thrilled to be a part of these activities developing 'finer and motor skills' in special children.





Rally on Assam: Students of NSS showcased the culture of Assam by the means of a rally in which students are dressed up in asmees attire along with different posters related to their culture, food, clothes, crops etc. The rally was full of excitement; even the other university students join them and followed their typical asmees steps.





Demonstartion on plantation: Dr. Aditi R Khandelwal, Sr. Assistant Professor IIS (Deemed to be University) Jaipur were welcomed. Her lecture was on Plant varieties available at market. She demonstrated how to put a plant both indoor and outdoor. She showcased different varieties of indoor plant, which are very user friendly. Poster Making: Ms Sheetal, Assistant Professor IIS (Deemed to be University) gave a knowledgeable and fulfilled lecture in NSS Special camp. The main aim of the session was to get familier with assam culture by the means of poster making. The students learn poster making skills, how to make an expressive and acute posters.



Day 4: 29th Jan 2020

Yoga session: The day started with yoga session by Ms. JankiPareek. The NSS volunteers learnt and practiced various aasanas during the session. In the session, the instructor also tell them about various mantra like gayatri mantra, saraswati mantra and make the volunteers understood their importance in keeping one self fit. Towards the end of session, the instructor makes the volunteers practice meditation by spelling "OM".

Demonstration on Seed Ball Preparation: The second session of the day was taken by Mr. Nikhil of Podha NGO. The NGO Podha works for conservation of forest in the country. In the session Mr. Nikhil talked about his latest initative – "Seed Balls". Seed Balls are ball of mud and potters clay carrying seeds of trees. These ball when thrown in monsoon on soil leads to birth of a plant without any other efforts. Sir, explained the process of preparing the balls to the volunteers .He informed that such balls can be prepared for all kind of plants and trees. NSS volunteers also prepared the seed ball in his supervision during the session.

Students of govt school participated with full enthusiasm and are looking very excited to perform tomorrow. 12 Volunteers of Group C went to Kalyanpura School with the project on stress management during examination. They have shown documentary to students to cope with situation of stress during examination. They also have made the charts

related to theme and explained them to the students. 

Projects in Schools:

and interesting pictorial presentation to make the children understand the concept of seasons in the country. The student volunteers sketched map of India on the wall of school for school children to understand the regional diversity of the country. All the students showed great enthusiasm while teaching the school children. Industrial Visit

Date- 24th January, 2020

Place- Dev Milk Foods Pvt. Ltd. Mahindra World City, Village Kalwar, Jaipur-302037

Educational tours are essential for overall development of students. They provide valuable educational opportunities away from the classroom without using textbooks and other tools used in usual settings. Students on educational trips can often learn while having fun in a more informal environment.

An industrial visit was organized on 24th January, 2020 for 1st year Yuva members of the University. The aim of the visit was to provide practical exposure to the students where they could experience the operations of making various dairy and ice- cream products.

A batch of 50 students and two faculty coordinators (Dr. Anju Singh and Dr. Megha Arya) left the IISU campus at 10:05a.m and reached the arena of FruBon at 11:00 a.m. The management received the students and accompanying teachers with a warm welcome and guided them through the site. To begin with, the HR Manager and his team gave the students an introduction of company's history, profile and its present functioning in Dairy, Ice cream and Bakery products like milk, cheese, butter, Yoghurt, Buttermilk, Ice-Cream, Paneer, Cookies, and others. Some of the team members even shared their experiences with the company and asked the students their views about the FruBon products. They also ensured the students that in near future their products will match any good product in the market.

Next, the students were divided into two groups- one group to visit the ice cream production unit and the second group to visit the bakery section. Then, hygiene and safety precautions were taken and everyone was made to wear head-cap before entering the factory. Also, a set of strict safety rules were informed to the students.

In the white products division, the students were accompanied by Mr. Mohammed Shabid (Plant Manager-dairy section). The demonstration was initiated by informing about various sophisticated and advanced technology and machinery used for manufacturing in the factory. Next, the students were made aware of the process involved in procurement and pasteurizing of milk and were given demonstration of the making and packaging of various products. Then the students were also taken to the cold room with a temperature of 5°C, where various dairy products are stored.

In the ice cream section, the students were escorted by Mr. Rahul (Deputy Manager-Ice cream). Firstly, the students visited the laboratory where all kinds of physical, biological and chemical testing are done. Next, it was followed by a visit to the raw materials storage segment. The aroma of the ice -creams filled their hearts with joy. Then the students were made aware about different stages of milk processing and the process involved in making ice- cream and they enjoyed the fascinating site in making. Then the students visited the auto candy machine room where 6000 ice creams are produced in an hour. The students werefascinated even more when they were taken to the Blast Room with the temperature of -35°C. The students were flabbergasted by the bursting of cold air on their faces. The young Icgians were overwhelmed with joy and enthusiasm after they were offered complementary ice creams. This enthusiastic educational tour came to an end with a group photograph of the Yuva team and FruBon employees.



A Session on Stress Management Date - 27th January, 2020


Annual Play Workshop Inaugural 22nd August 2019

Guest Lecture on 'The Art of MIME' by Padmashri Niranjan Goswami 9th September, 2019

"We make the visible invisible and the invisible visible."

This is how Padmashri Niranjan Goswami describes his art form: mime.

On the 9th of September, 2019, Shri Niranjan Goswami visited the IIS University as a guest lecturer and guided the students of the Theatrical Society about the foundation of mime in India and its origin. Shri Niranjan Goswami was born in 1949, Dhaka, Bangladesh. He trained in mime with Jogesh Dutta from 1966 to 1969 at the latter's institution Padaboli, and trained himself in theatre working with Sombhu Mitra at Bohurupee between 1970 and 1975. He established the Indian Mime Theatre in 1976. Shri Goswami has advanced the practice of mime as an independent genre in Indian theatre with his performances over the past two decades. Among his significant productions are Sonarganyer Meye (1983), Dena Paona (1989), Srikanta (1990), Beej (1995), and Nagamandala (1997). Most of these are based on well-known literary works. To build up an audience for mime, Shri Goswami has been organizing festivals of mime theatre since the mid-1980s. He has also taught mime at several institutions, including the National School of Drama in Delhi, the Trissur School of Drama, and the Film and Television Institute of India, Pune. He has given lecture- demonstrations at the University of California at Los Angeles, U.S.A., and the Jawaharlal Nehru University in Delhi. Shri Goswami has been working with deaf children for several years, some of whom have won young Talent Scholarships of the Government of India. He has performed in the World Youth Festival (1989) in Pyongyang, North Korea, and the Shanghai International Art Festival (2002) in China, and has besides toured Europe, the former Soviet Union, and the United States as a cultural delegate. Among other honours, he has received the All India Critics Association Award in 1998. He was awarded a Senior Research Fellowship by the Department of Culture, Government of India, in 2001. Shri Niranjan Goswami received the Sangeet Natak Akademi Award for his excellence as an actor in mime.

As part of the lecture, Sir illustrated the intricacies of mime. He taught the students the relevance of painting the face in mime, how the whole body acts instead of words, the extraction of mime from Natyashastra as 'Mukhabhinaya' and many such things. Currently, Sir has founded the National Mime Institute in Kolkata that gives a post graduate course in theatre. 250 students attended the lecture.

For the students, it was an enlightening experience to meet somebody with such a powerful aura. Sir left them with an insight to the world of mime. He taught the students how one must incarnate oneself into the object so as to understand the art. It was an enriching experience to say the least.





Guest Lecture on Chhau Dance by Mr. Jagannath Seth 16th September, 2019

Knowledge is best gained if someone experienced shares it. On 16th September, 2019 Mr. Jagannath Seth, a specialist in Chhau dance came to the IIS (deemed to be University) for a guest lecture, organised by IISU Theatrical Society. 250 students gathered for the session.

Jagannath Seth, an alumnus of National School of Drama is an actor, dancer and a Chhau artist. He has done total of 42 plays and has won many state and national level drama competitions. It was mind blowing to watch this personality perform.

The program began with his warm welcome. Jagannath sir talked about the origin of chhau and its types. He talked about 3 kinds of chhau, belonging to Bengal, Jharkhand and Odisha respectively. He efficiently taught us about various musical instruments which are used in chhau including dhol, nagada. Not just this, he explained the relevance and importance of the use of mask in chhau dance. Moreover, he talked about different kinds of costumes used in depicting different characters.

The program was uplifted when he himself performed and showcased the magic of chhau. It was mesmerising to watch him perform. The kind of balance and patience he had was remarkable. He briefly explained the mythological connection chhau dance holds as an art form. His body was full of grace, beauty and charm. He is definitely an epitome of talent and skills.

The event ended with an interactive session where students cleared their doubts about chhau. Lastly, he was thanked and praised with a round of applause. This event was entirely full of knowledge, adventure and experience.

Annual Play 2019 titled "Ek Bhoot Ki Atmakatha"

23rd September, 2019

50 students of the IISU Theatrical Society staged their Annual Play 2019 titled "Ek Bhoot Ki Atmakatha" on 23rd September, 2019. The play was a culmination of a 30 day workshop that taught the participants various styles of theatre, disciplines and etiquettes of working on stage.

The Chief Guest of the play was, the renowned theatre and film artist, Ms. Ratna Pathak Shah. She not only acknowledged the teams' efforts into creating the play but also provided useful insights about what the focus points while performing should be. The entirety of the play was a result of a lot of time put in and had its own moments. After all, Rome wasn't built in day.

Process and milestones of the workshop:

The journey of 30 days was a splendid one. Each step, leading the students to become better actors and moreover, better people with strong personas.

The workshop began with the basic step of familiarization. Introducing themselves, the students' ideas and reasons to join theatre acted as a small window to knowing the team. They got to know the director, Mr. Siva Prasad Tumu and understood his expectations from the play, the team and his work ethics.

The very next step and one of the most important one was that of interpretation. It involved looking at the play beyond literal levels of understanding. Participants pondered upon the message these stories are trying to convey and how they link them to the real world. Through this, they got an outlook upon how the participants were not there as blank slates but came with their own set of thoughts which needed to be spoken out.

Portrayal through improvisations was a very intriguing step of the process. It not only showed how creative the participants were but also brought out their opinions in a structured manner. Each group gave different forms of the same story in different styles like mime, musical or dance drama or through plain narratives but withintricate formats.

Through these improvisations, the director moved on to character blocking. This was done through linking the participants' personalities with the characters' needs. Each person brought their own eccentrics and ideography as a contribution to the characters' development.

Once the blocking was complete, the plot as a whole was formed. The loop holes were understood and covered and each story was worked upon numerous times with several different styles. In this, our acting trainers, Mr. Jagannath Seth and Mr. Mahesh Godeshwar, played a significant role.

The participants were introduced to Chaau dance and Pina Bausch's style of theatrics. Mr. Seth made them understand the importance of inculcating the habit of feeling the rhythm of the music and the essence of the story and bringing it out in our movements. Mr. Godeshwar essentially worked on building an aura and leaving your presence on stage long after you've exited. Speech should not be limited only to words and dialogues but should create a link between the actor and the audience was his training motto.

The first run through was an impactful moment and nothing less than a milestone in this workshop. The students understood what the play was trying to tell us, how strong its message is and how much more we need to contribute to it. It was one of the most emotionally moving aspect of this workshop.

Further to this came the stages of property development, set development, lighting and music settings and most importantly the art of projection techniques. The participants actively worked through the nitty-gritties of the play. Among other things was understanding how to use the stage space and exploring all possibilities of the set that was so vigorously made.

One thing that this workshop taught everybody all is that 'Theatre' is not just being on stage and delivering dialogues. It's about understanding others and more importantly, ourselves. From getting rid of inhibitions, stage fears and mental blocks to knowing that no matter how quirky you might be, theatre accepts you for who you are.



Participation in Intercollegiate Ad Mad Competition at JNU

All the performances touched the hearts of the audience which was evident from the kind of applaud and cheers they gave. The audience definitely motivated the performance with their utmost support.




Performance of skit 'Blush & Brush' 25th January, 2020


Tree Plantation Drive

The internship was facilitated by the Centre forSwachh Bharat-Swastha-Bharat. Overall 42 students participated in the internship program. The aim of the internship program was to spread awareness among villagers about the cleanliness and hygiene, solid waste management. As per the guidelines of Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, a work plan for 50 hrs in 8 days including suggested activities by the ministry was prepared.

Day 1, 4th July

Activity: Door-to-door visit, school-level promotion of the 3Rs (Reduce, Reuse, Recycle)

Thefirst day of internship aimed to build a rapport with villagers and spread awarenessamong villagers regarding the personal hygiene and cleanliness, disposable plastic and garbage collection. The students were divided into groups and sent to different 'dhanis' for door-to-door survey. Students of the IIS(deemed to be UNIVERSITY) interacted with villagers and talked about segregation of biodegradable and non-biodegradable waste, reducing the use of plastics and reusing materials. They were also informed about what the students are going to do in the coming days in village and asked for their cooperation too. It was observed during the survey thatmost of the villagers are indulged in agriculture and farming occupation. Most of the houses had toilet and bathroom but there was no proper drainage system in the village. It was very surprised for the students that in the absence of any garbage dumping area villagers were use to dump their garbage in nearby dried well. Those who do not have any well or digs throw their garbage in open area. When the students asked them not to dump their garbage in open area they came with the complain that municipality van for garbage collection do not come to their village and they do not have any alternate for it. Throughout the survey we discovered that the major problem was the lack of a waste collection mechanism, which if present would improve the condition greatly. Almost 50 houses were found to have compost pit in their houses and they were using it properly.

One group of 9 students visited the primary school of the village-Hasampura. They interacted with students and talked about personal hygiene, keeping the school premises clean and reuse, reduce and recycle the waste.

Day 2, 5th July

Activity: Cleaning of streets and collection of plastics

On the second day the volunteers were divided into groups and allocated different areas of the Hasampura village to undertake the task of cleanliness. Cleanliness drive was carried out in which streets were cleaned plastics waste was collected in bags which were then taken by the van of the IIS (deemed to be University).

Students picked up pieces of non biodegradable material like plastic, glass and thermocol in large bags. During the waste collection drive, the volunteers visited the houses and asked them to not to throw the waste outside nor to burn the waste and asked them to segregate the dry and wet waste. Further volunteers explained the disadvantages of throwing garbage or waste such as plastic outside their homes.

Students swept the streets pushing away the biodegradable materials to the side of the roads. Many women participated in cleaning littered areas around their houses. Each group of students collected approximately around 8-10 kgs plastic waste. All the volunteers participated in the activity with enthusiasm and showcased great team spirit and cooperation.

Field Visit to Hasanpura Village as part of Community Engagement Service

11th January, 2020

Field visit to Hasanpura village, located in Jaipur District, was organized by Department of Management in coordination with Centre for Swachh Bharat Swasth Bharat of IIS (Deemed to be University), Jaipur on 11th January, 2020. The resource persons for the day were Mr. OmprakashSaini (Agricultural Supervisor), Dr. Vijay Kumar (Assistant Agricultural Officer). The visit was organized with the motive of acquainting the students of MBA regarding the process of vermicomposting on a large scale as part of their community engagement services paper. The resource persons stated that vermicomposting is one of the easiest methods to recycle agricultural and to produce quality compost. Students were demonstrated howvermicompost is prepared by using earthworms in vermicomposting bins. The soil conditioning and plant strengthening effects of vermicomposting were also explained to the students. The students were given guidelines for identifying the appropriate sites for installing vermicomposting bins. The overall visit highlighted the importance of vermicomposting in enhancing plant growth, organic farming and the avenues it opens for social entrepreneurship.

Entrepreneurship Survey, Jalshakti Team Constituion, Water Conservation Campaign at village Nevta

14th September 2019

"Rural entrepreneurship can be defined as entrepreneurship emerging at village level which can take place in a variety of fields of endeavor such as business, industry, agriculture and acts as a potent factor for economic development". For the purpose of finding such potent factors in rural areas, a village visit was organized by Department of Management: HRM & IB, IIS (deemed to be University), Jaipur at Nevta on 14th September 2019. 25 students of the University visited different places such as school, hospital, Gram PanchayatOffice, shops etc. to conduct a survey on various parameters related to Rural Entrepreneurship in village Nevta and to understand the problems and challenges for rural entrepreneurship in the context of rural development. The visit had following objectives:-

- To find out the need of support system for rural entrepreneurs in Nevta.
- To find out any opportunity for establishing startups in rural areas.
- To find out the requirement of need of skill development in rural areas like Nevta.



Jalshakti Team Constitution, Water Conservation Awareness Campaign, at village Ramjipura

14th September, 2019

A team of 50 students and 2 faculty members visited Village Ramjipura on 14th September, 2019 for Jalshakti Team Constitution, Water Conservation Awareness Campaign.Out of the total households surveyed (39); the population of the village is 243. The Gender Ratio is 960 females 1000 males and the average members per family are 6.

Out of the total households surveyed the total females were 119. Between 0-5 years were 7, 6-18 were 59, 19-45 were 59, 46 years and above were 26. The total male population was 124 out of which between 0-5 years were 5, 6-18 years were 26, 19-45 years were 63, 46 years and above were 30.

Out of the total households surveyed 42.86% of SC households, 11.11 % ST households, 0% OBC households and 50% general households lie in below poverty line (BPL) Category.

Out of the total households surveyed, 100% SC population, 90.91% ST population, 95.2% OBC population and 100% General population were under Aadhaar coverage. Out of the total households surveyed, 75.86% SC population, 89.66 % ST population, 67.39 % OBC population and 93.94 % General population had bank accounts.

The nearly all households had access to PM Ujjwala yojana and Swachh Bharat Mission Toilets. 28.21% benefited from PM Awas Yojana, 5.13% from Fasal Bima Yojana, 5.13% Krishi Sinchai Yojana, 5.13% from Soil Health Card, 23.06% from Kisan Credit Card and 2.56% from Jan Aushadhi Yojana.

1.65% had benefited from PM Jan dhan Yojana, 0.82 from Sukanya Samriddhi Yojana, 2.56% from Mudra Yojana, 0.78% from Jeevan Jyoti Bima Yojana, 0.41% Suraksha Bima Yojana, 3.29% from Atal pension Yojana, 0.82% from Kaushal Vikas yojana, 2.44% from Ladli Lakshmi yojana and 2.38% from Janani Suraksha Yojana.

Most of the Migration was done on daily basis to nearby areas like Muhana, Neota, Sanganer, etc as people had private businesses like tent houses, grocery shops, Tempo services, etc. Out of the total households surveyed under caste wise migration pattern, 9.1 % of SC population, 18.2 % of ST population, 36.4 % of GEN population and 36.4% of OBC population.

The Total Literacy Rate is 71.60%, Male Literacy Rate is 82.26% and Female Literacy rate is 60.50%. Govt. Primary School is located within 1kms and private primary school is within 1- 3 kms. No other educational institute, Government or private was located within 1 kms. All higher schools were located from 3-6 kms in Neota or Muhana. There was a Private Diploma College located within 3 kms of the Village. Other than that there was no other centre for higher education located within 15kms.

88.89% males and 93.10% females were enrolled in school. The ratio of boys to girls having School education was 21: 25 whereas in college education is 34:10.

Out of the total households surveyed, 22 males and 47 females were not literate, 14 males and 17 females were literate, 17 males and 11 females completed 5th Standard, 12 males and 16 females completed 8th Standard, 13 males and 7 females completed 10th Standard, 11 males and 11 females completed 12th Standard, 2 males completed an ITI Diploma, 24 males and 5 females were Graduates and 9 males and 5 females were either Post Graduates or Professionals.

There were no Primary health centres, no civil hospital and no Doctor available at the Village. Major Health problems were Diabetes, Asthma, Paralysis, etc.

Out of the total households surveyed, 42.1% used to Piped water, 25% used Community Taps, 19.7% used Hand Pump and 13.2% used Open Well for Drinking water.

Out of the total households surveyed, 66.7% households had no waste collection system, 10.3% had door step waste collection and 23.1% had common point waste collection system.

Out of the total households surveyed, in 20.5% households, Drainage was covered, 53.8% households it was open and in 25.6% households had no drainage.

Out of the total households surveyed, 71.8% had no compost pit, 20.5% households has individual compost pit and 7.7% had group compost pit.

Out of the total households surveyed 85.71% of SC households, 88.89 % ST households, 86.67 % OBC households and 87.5 % general households had toilets.

Out of the total households surveyed 14.2% of SC households, 11.11 % ST households, 18.83% OBC households and 12.50 % general households followed open defecation. 85.71% of SC households, 88.89 % ST households, 80% OBC households and 62.5% general households had Private toilets.

Out of the total households surveyed 14.29% of SC households, 11.11 % ST households, 13.33% OBC households and 12.50% general households had Pucca House type.

37.5% of the village has Kutcha roads and 62.5% had Pucca Road Connectivity, The village was connected via Pucca Road to a State Highway. It was approximately 8 kms long, 5 kms of which was constructed via Pradhan Mantri Sadak Yojana and the rest was under construction.

Village had no basic Infrastructure and amenities like bank, ATM, SHGs, Electricity office, Post Office, Gas Agencies, Petrol Pumps, Krishi Mandi, Kisan Sewa Kendra, Railway Station, Bus Stop, Sports facility, Veterinary care hospitals, etc.

Out of the total households surveyed, 50% of the land available was under agriculture, 25% under Housing and 25% was wasteland. 12.8% was under irrigation whereas 87.2% was unirrigated.

1Acre of Government Forest Area was present, other than that there was no community or private forest or horticultural land. The common tree species were Neem (0.2acre), Babool (0.1acre), Khejri (0.25 acre), etc.

There was no river source available in the area. Out of the total households surveyed, 65.6% households used Bore well irrigation, 12.5% used tank Irrigation and 18.6% had no irrigation. 60.7% households used Sprinkler irrigation method, 10.7% used Flooding and 58.6% used none.

Out of the total households surveyed, 33 used no chemical fertilizers and 6% used them. 37% used no chemical Insecticides whereas 2% used them. Major Crops that were sown were: Bajra (39.3%), Jowar (32.1%), and Wheat (21.4%). Other crops were sarso, gwar, etc.

Agricultural Productivity of the Crops was: Bajra- 39.3%, Jowar- 30.8% and Wheat- 27.1%.

Out of the total households surveyed, 20% has Pucca shelter for Livestock, 56.7% had Kutcha shelter for livestock and 23.3% had open shelter for livestock.

Out of the total households surveyed, the SC households had 6% buffalo population, 2% cow population and 3% Goat and sheep population; the ST households had 9% buffalo population, 6% cow population and 6% Goat and sheep population; the OBC households had 11% buffalo population, 10% cow population and 4% Goat and sheep population and the General households had 5% buffalo population, 2% cow population and 4% Goat and sheep population.

Out of the total Households surveyed, the occupational pattern is as follows: 42 males and 32 females have their own Cropping land. 3 Males and 7 females work in Animal Husbandry sector, 6 males and 3 females are skilled wage workers, 2 males are unskilled wage workers, 8 males were under salaries employment in private sector and 11 males had other trade and Business.

Out of the total households surveyed, the Annual Average Income of a SC household is Rs.195000, a ST household is Rs.37333, an OBC household is Rs.98133 and a General Households is Rs.43750.

Out of the total households surveyed, 13.2% if SC households,43.2% of OBC Households, 16.5% ST households and 27.2% General Households have registered electricity Connection.

Out of the total households surveyed, 100 use electricity as lightening Source.

Out of the total households surveyed, 74.4% use LPG, 17.9% use wood and 7.7% use cow dung as cooking Fuel.

Out of the total households surveyed, 85.71% of SC Households use Traditional Chullah and 14.29% of Smokeless Chullah. Rest all ST, OBC and General Households use Smokeless Chullahs.

IDENTIFICATION OF THE VILLAGE PROBLEM:

The biggest village problem is that it lacks almost all governmental infrastructure and basic amenities. Apart from a primary government school, the village lacks every other important and amenities like bank, ATM, SHGs, Electricity office, Post Office, Gas Agencies, Petrol Pumps, Krishi Mandi, Kisan Sewa Kendra, Railway Station, Bus Stop, Sports facility, Veterinary care hospitals, etc.

Also, there is a shortage of water and the lost of households have shifted their main occupation to other jobs like wage labourers, private tent houses, grocery shops, etc due to lack of water for irrigation.

Their ground water level is also depleting, and if such a trend continues, it will not be long that those remaining agricultural families will have to make the transition.

STRATEGIES:

Rainwater Harvesting is recommended in this area which can be done by 'Nadi' construction, which is a prevalent practice in Rajasthan. It will help in providing surface water and also can regenerate groundwater eventually.

All government facilities are available nearby, but, not in the Surveyed area. Hence, the residents must request their representatives for the same.

Jalshakti Team Constitution, Water Conservation Awareness Campaign, at village HasamPura

11 - 14th September, 2019

Analysis of household survey in Hasampura revealed severe problem of groundwaterdepletion in the village. Under this several activities were undertaken to identify the water related problems and create awareness among the adults as well as children of the village for conservation of water. A Jal Shakti Team was constituted involving the faculties and students from IIS (deemed to be University), Jaipur. Members of Jal Shakti team of the University visited and conducted activities in the village. Details of the activities are:

Problem Identification

Members of Jal Shakti team of IIS (deemed to be University), Jaipur visited the Hasampura village to have an idea about the existing water conservation activities undertaken by the villagers, water related problems, which they are facing and to formulate strategies to deal with those problems. One day before the visit Sarpanch was informed and he was requested to inform the villagers about the Jal Shakti team visit. Villagers were asked to gather at a common place and the activity started with a discussion on present status of water in the village. During the discussion the problems identified related to water are: There is an acute problem of water in the

village and there is no alternate resource except Nevta bandh. The villagers did not just face problems with respect to irrigation for agriculture but also experienced difficulties in arranging water for day to day activities. The ground water level in the village had depleted alarmingly over the years.

Villagers were found aware about the water scarcity in their village and they are facing it too but surprisingly not doing anything for water conservation. Male complained that women at home wastes water a lot but women did not agreed to their statement. Although they are informed about water scarcity in Rajasthan through different media sources but not taking any step to resolve this problem due to lack of self-realization. Only two-three households were found to have installed the system of water harvesting. No further step was taken to renovate the traditional water bodies like wells, ponds etc.





Constitution of "Gram Jal Shakti Team" in Hasampura

A Jal Shakti team of total seven members were constituted in Hasampura village. Two women and three men from the village and two faculty members of IIS (deemed to be university, Jaipur), Dr. AlkaKataria and Ms. Archana Kumari were included in the team. Approval of the village Sarpanch was taken for the Gram Jal Shakti Team.





Expert Talk on Water Conservation

An expert talk was organized in Hasampura village on 11 September, 2019. The expert was Dr. AlkaKataria, Assistant professor, Department of Environment Science, IIS (deemed to be university, Jaipur). She began her talk with importance of water and scarcity of it especially in Rajasthan. She said that water conservation should begin from home itself and teaching the future generation about the value of every drop of water should be practiced in each household. She suggested few measures for saving water and appealed especially to women present there to practice those strategies at their home. She talked about the depletion of groundwater level in the village and suggested the villagers to save rain water through the technique of rainwater harvesting. She also suggested few techniques to farmers for using and storing

rainwater efficiently for irrigation in their farms. Tree plantation on a huge scale was also suggested by the expert.

A poster making competition was organized in government school of Hasampura. The purpose to organize this competition was to make children aware about the ways they can adopt in their day-to-day life for saving water by using it efficiently. Before making the poster children were explained by the students of IIS (deemed to be University), Jaipur about how and when they generally waste water in their daily activities and how they can save water. It was very surprising to see that many students showed the ways of water being wasted in their surroundings through pictures or writing on paper.

In accordance with the letter received from MHRD for conducting activities related to water conservation by the University, the following activities were conducted. The activities were taken up in the Village *Muhana* which has been adopted by the University for its Development.

Date: 10/09/2019

- In order to conduct activities related to water conservation, a *Jal Shakti* team of 10 members in the University was constituted including eight students and two faculty members.
- The *Jal shakti* team visited the Muhana Village for a survey regarding the awareness regarding water conservation and the household usage of water.
- A *Gram Jal Shakti* team comprising of six members of the village was constituted in the presence of *Sarpanch* and secretary of *Muhana* Village for further implementation of water conservation related activities in the village





Date: 11/09/2019

- Lectures by experts Dr. Charu Jhamaria and Ms. Tanya Singh were delivered regarding the significance of water conservation and possible methods which can be adopted by the village regarding water conservation.
- The *jal shakti* team also interacted with the villagers regarding the adverse health and environmental effects of use of single use plastics.
- Degradable trash bags were distributed to the households for collection of plastic waste.







Colouring Activity on "Say No to Plastic"

15th October 2019

The Department of Business Studies of IIS (deemed-to-be) university, under the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan scheme of Government of India has conducted an activity on "Say No to Plastic" for creating awareness regarding ill effects of using plastic among the students of government primary school, Neveta. A team of 30 students of the department, for the purpose conducted a colouring activity in school. After the activity, students of school were made aware about the harms caused by using plastic materials in our life and its impact on the environment. They were also guided not to use and let others not to use plastic items like plastic bottles, polythene bags, etc. The children enthusiastically participated in the activity and promised not to use plastic in the future and also agreed to create awareness regarding it in their community. Atthe end colours were gifted to the students of the school from the students' team from university.

The spectacular dance and drama which stole the hearts of everyone. The power and energy exhibited by youngsters was be filling to the occasion and arced their commitment and dedication and assured of a brighter future ahead.

Since Xth class Board Exam is approaching soon, so it was worth talking to the students about "Management of Examination Stress". Ms Archana Kumari, Assistant Professor IIS (deemed to be university) discussed few tips to manage the stress before and during the exam.

A vote of thanks was tabled by the the principal, Ms. Manisha in the end.

15 July, 2019






Investment Awareness Drive

Gender Discrimination

14th September 2019

The Department of Home Science of the IIS University organized an extension activity on Gender Discrimination on 14th Sept 2019 in Haziyawala community. The extension activity was organized by **Ms. Archanakumari**, Assistant Professor, Department of H.Sc, Human Development and 5 students of B.Sc (H) H.Sc Semester III.

The programme aimed at creating awareness among women and children of urban slum about gender discrimination at home, school and public places.

The target group for this activity was women and primary school children of Haziawala community. The reason behind selecting this particular section was that when the NSS team of IISU was conducting their activity, it was observed by the coordinator that many students especially females are irregular. The principal of the school informed that she talked to their mother and got to know that since in most of the family both the parents are working and they leave their daughter at home to take care of the home and siblings. So a urgent need was felt to conduct an extension activity in this area.

The activity was organized in the premises of Haziawala Government Primay school after taking the prior permission from the principal of the school. A total of 106 women and children of the community attended the activity.

The whole activity was planned in three steps namely, Presentation, Role Play, games and Interaction with women and children. Materials were prepared accordingly like pictorial self- explanatory PPT, costumes, stickpuppets for games etc.

First a game was played by all the participants in which questions were asked by the students regarding expected gender role. All the participants were given sticks puppet having pictures of girl and boy. They were asked to show the appropriate puppet according to them suited for that particular role. This game was conducted to have an idea about the prevailing gender streotypes and perception of gender role in the community. It was surprising to know that most of the household chores were expected to be done by the girl child whereas male child were given much freedom.

This was followed by a role play performed by all students depicting different ways in which gender discrimination is done by parents, family members and teachers. All the students participated in this role play as per the role assigned to them.

Lastly an interactive and counseling session was held with the help of pictorial PPT. Women were counseled to give equal opportunity to their girl child in every field. They were told about the changing gender roles in today's society with the help of PPT.

It was observed that the interactive session was very effective. Women and children interacted with students about their prejudices and stereotypical thought. Many of them said that they also faced gender discrimination in their own family in their childhood. So they have those prejudices that girls are supposed to perform household chores and boys are better at outside work. One old lady was very sad as she was having two three granddaughters and no grandson. Many females were having two-three daughter but they are hoping to have a boy baby in the next delivery. Many females were workers and they shared their feelings that how they are being discriminated by their employer for their wages and leaves. Towards the end some of them realized that they need to change their stereotypical thought regarding gender roles. The activity was ended with a hope that one day they will raise their voice against this shameful act. In the end small refreshments were given to all the participants. i.e. Poha and tea.

Children up to the ageof 5-6 year along with their mother were invitedby the ASHA worker of anganwadi the session started with the discussion about what all duties and activities are performed by the ASHA WORKER how well the community responds to her effectsshe Also briefed about what difficulties she faces on daily basis incurring out of her work this was followed by a presentation prepared by student of IIS university Jaipur regarding breast feeding, infant and young child feeding practices, demonstration on preparing of different premixes and Intensified Diarrhoea Control Fortnight (IDCF). The session was very interactive as each topic was carefully listened by the mothers and they also shared their views regarding the same. This was accompanied by a brief given by the ASHA worker about her experience in dealing with these practises on daily basis. A documentary was also presented on the importance of managing and preventing diarrhoea and was very appreciated by all. ASHA worker explained how she faces difficulties in convincing parents regarding adoption of right feeding practices because of their personal beliefs and myths. In order to contribute these, regular trainings are organised for ASHA workers tomanage such situations. At the end of session, refreshments were distributed to the chidren and their mother for being so cooperative during the entire session. Overall the whole session was very informative both for us and the audience.

As not just in rural areas but even in urban and semi urban areas women suffer from anemia and other diseases because of lack of proper health and nutrition which led to increase in infant mortality rate and birth of weak infants. She said that if the society wants to ensure safety for women; instead of restricting girls, boys should be taught make how to behave.

She also said if we want to invest in a woman, we should, do it since her childhood. A woman should have access to all life chances, social prestige and security to become a productive individual in the society. The session was followed by discussion and students asked their queries. In the end vote of thanks was given by Professor SharadRathore, Programme officer NSS. 60 students of the department attended the programme.

Focused Group Interview

2nd March, 2020

Women's Cell, Centre for Women's Studies and Department of Sociology, IIS (deemed to be University) organized the field visit to GanwarBrahmana village in SanganerTehsil on 2nd March 2020. Dr. Pragya Sharma and DrPreetiAgrawat escorted 40 students. Focused group interview was conducted with women and young girls of the village. Women discussed about various problems which many times they can't be able to discuss when general interview is conducted. Women opened up with problems related to menstrual hygiene, pregnancy, other health issues and child rearing. They even discussed about the problems existing in village regarding their political participation, working in MNAREGA, drainage and sanitation system of village, unavailability of proper health facilities in village, dissatisfaction regarding the working of Sarpanch and transportation facilities. Students also interacted with the school and college going girls to know about the education opportunities and awareness regarding hygiene. Women were very interactive and responded properly. They shared their experiences. Students tried to make them aware about the women's rights, hygiene and various government policies.





Report of Field Visit to Nevta Village 14th September, 2019

One -day field visit to Nevta village, located in Sanganer tehsil, Jaipur district, was organized by the Department of Sociology on 14 September, 2019. The visit was a part of Plastic Free Campaign being organized by the university. Twenty students organized an awareness campaign in the government school. The school students were given information about the harmful effects of plastic on health and environment. The students also prepared posters on the theme "Say No to Plastic". The posters were pasted inside the school premises so that they can function as constant reminders for the students as well as the visitors in the school for discontinuing the use of plastic. The school students were also made to take a pledge that they will not use plastic in future and will also motivate their family members and neighbours to follow the same footsteps and also search for alternate means of plastic items.

Guest Lecture on 'Breast cancer Awareness' 22nd October 2019

Where in every four minutes one woman is diagnosed with breast cancer and in every thirteen minutes one woman dies of it. Therefore, it makes it essential to have cancer literacy in women and for this, an initiative was taken by Women Cell ofDepartment of Sociology by organizing a guest lecture on 22nd October 2019 to raise awareness for breast cancer among Indian women and health professionals.

Ms. Archita and Ms. Angana stated that because of low cancer literacy the risk factors are more among Indian women, irrespective of their socio-economic and educational background. Considering this fact, there is an urgent need for nation- and state-wide awareness programmes, engaging multiple stakeholders of society and the health system, to help improve cancer literacy in India. They also shared the information and tips on how a woman could take care of herself and can examine herself initially for breast cancerat home. As they were the face of Sanjeevani NGO, they told us about how their NGO functions in terms of helping people who suffer from cancer.

The overall session was informative and concluded with a question-answer round. The session helped the students to gain knowledge regarding breast cancer which will not only be helpful for them but also making more people aware of this. 80 students attended the lecture.







Field Visit to Ganwar Brahmanan Village

30th August, 2019

One -day field visit to Ganwar Brahmanan village, located in Sanganer tehsil, Jaipur district was organized by the Department of Sociology on 30 August, 2019. The visit was organized with the motive of familiarizing the students with various aspects of rural life. 100 students were divided into five groups of ten each and following activities were undertaken:

- Hands on training for using participatory rural appraisal technique with the help of tools like resource mapping, transit walk, social mapping and wealth mapping.
- Interaction with the villagers regarding various aspects of rural life and discussion about their cultural and sanitation practices.
- Visit to the government school and interaction with the students of eighth standard.
- Acquiring information about the operative procedures of mid-day meal scheme in the school from the school authorities.
 - The students participated in the activities enthusiastically and were able to develop a rapport with the adults in the village and the children which will help them in their future visits.

Social Equality: A Challenge for Women in Society 12 March, 2020

On the occasion of International Women's day 2020, Dr. Priyamvada Singh spoke on 'Equality for Women' as she has started a campaign called 'Each for Equality' which tries to cover the issues of women across generations. 60 students participated in the event. Dr. Priyamvada commenced the session by talking about her journey in the field of social service and what factors motivated her to work for people. She spoke about various challenges faced by women in the society irrespective of their backgrounds and how they put other before themselves.

She discussed importance of education for women and the need for the women to improve upon their levels of nutrition. The problems should be addressed from the very beginning as individuals are taught to discriminate themselves and others specially on the basis of gender and this results in a society that starts taking women for second class citizens. As not just in rural areas but even in urban and semi urban areas women suffer from anemia and other diseases because of lack of proper health and nutrition which led to increase in infant mortality rate and birth of weak infants. She said that if the society wants to ensure safety for women; instead of restricting girls, boys should be taught make how to behave.

She also said if we want to invest in a woman, we should, do it since her childhood. A woman should have access to all life chances, social prestige and security to become a productive individual in the society. The session was followed by discussion and students asked their queries. In the end vote of thanks was given by Professor SharadRathore, Programme officer NSS.

Session on Gender Sensitization and Movie screening

3rd August, 2019

In the Declaration of Independence Thomas Jefferson had acknowledged the fact that all human beings are endowed with unalienable rights and so we can all strive to be happy. The society has differences based on which there are some necessary categorizations and these are meant to make society functional without compromising on the basic rights but there are also certain differences that amount to inequality and exclusion; gender is one of the identities that often lead to cornering of humanity because of the complex inequality it involves. Gender is a social construct which demands people to act in certain ways depending on their biological make up curbing individual freedom. We have seen both men and women suffer due to societal pressure. Women have been at greater disadvantage in this regard and hence a lot of established norms need to be questioned, the society needs to be sensitized towards gender to create equal opportunities for both men and women.

In this direction Ms. Chanda Asani, Lecturer, Women Studies organized a session on 3rd August,2019 in A.V. hall under to address students on the topic "Gender Sensitization. 100 students were present for the session. The session began with discussion on minor observations in regard to treatment of gender especially women in various spaces like homes, workplaces, media etc. The objective was look into the reasons for specified discriminatory practices against women and the reasons for it. After this interactive session, the students were shown a movie titled 'Ek naya Mayna' that was based upon myths associated with menstrual cycle and how with a little effort we can normalize a natural biological phenomenon. The movie merely with two characters; mother and daughter sent a strong effective message as to why periods have certain taboos and what used to be the logic behind it. A woman is not polluted during menstrual cycle, this is only a societal narrow-mindedness that has been fuelled by rigid structures of the society. Girls must have the entire information about this bodily phenomenon and must respect themselves. This movie was directed by Radhika Sharma ,student of MJMC with UGC assistance. The participatory group included students from Journalism, Home Science and Financial Studies. The screening of movie was followed by a lot of experience sharing on the part of the students. It was an eye opener for the students. The movie covered biological, psychological, and sociological dimensions associated with menstrual cycle. There was a special emphasis on menstrual health too. Overall, the session could address a lot of less-talked issues surrounding menstruation in the society.
