

Distribution of Supplementary Nutrition to Pregnant and Lactating Mothers

Date: 14/9/2021

Venue: Anganwadi centre, Kalyanpura, Jaipur

Direct Beneficiary: 20 pregnant women and lactating mothers

The COVID-19 pandemic has severely affected the nutritional intake of pregnant women and lactating mothers, who typically eat last, and least, in their family. The existing challenging gender norms are further deepened by the lack of access to basic health and nutrition services like iron-folic acid and calcium supplementation, antenatal and postnatal check-ups. Although the impact of malnutrition may not visible now, it will have a lasting effect on women and infants as well, both of whom have unique and increased micronutrient requirements. Recognising the need of nutritional supplementation of this vulnerable group, the NSS unit of IIS (deemed to be University) distributed supplementary nutrition to pregnant women and lactating mothers. those women regarding taking care of their nutritional needs during pandemic. A total of 20 expecting and lactating mothers received food packets which included nutrient rich seasonal food items like mixed Dalia and fruits with a hope that all the women who attended the campaign will take healthy and nutritious food.









Plantation Drive for Poshan Vatika

Venue: Temple premises, Kalyanpura, Jaipur Indirect Beneficiary: 150 community people

A plantation drive was organised by NSS unit of IIS (Deemed to be University) on 21st of September 2021 in Kalyanpura area of Jaipur. A temple premises was selected for plantation so that plants can be taken care of by the family residing in the temple premises. 

Demonstration of Nutritious Bakery Products 27th September 2021

She first demonstrated the baking of a healthy granola, she combined all the displayed ingredients and mentioned the recipe and instructions to the audience via chat. Next, she demonstrated the preparations for a whole wheat tea-time cake. While instructing the audience, she also gave them useful tips and tricks to make baking easier for them.

She then, displayed the final baked goods, which were both nutritious and simple to recreate. After the demonstration, the floor was open for questions, and the session was ended with a thankyou note Archana ma'am delivered on behalf of the audience.

After the session, Dr. Sharad Rathore inspired all the NSS volunteers present with her words of encouragement. She motivated all the students to develop their existing skills into entrepreneurial ventures. The session ended with students discussing their skills such as baking, origami, making of paper bags and envelope etc. for future peer activities.

Everything was beautiful illustrated from how to start making a candle to How much time a candle takes to solidify. And in the end few volunteers also made some candles and enjoyed the activity.

Poster Making on Investment Awareness, Digital Frauds, Financial Literacy 15th November 2021



Eye Specialists recommend that most people should get their eyes tested every two years. However, in some circumstances, they may recommend more frequent sight tests; for example, if you are; Child wearing glasses, person suffering from diabetes, aged 40 or over and have a family history of glaucoma and aged 70 or over. Dr. Ashok Gupta, Chancellor – "In Covid times, due to excessive usage of electronic devices, Students and Staff strained their eyes throughout the year. Keeping this in mind, we decided to organize an Eye Checkup Camp so that everyone can get their eyes checked and benefit from it." Approx. 500 Students, Staff and members of the University got benefited from the Eye Checkup Camp.

As a part of NSS activity IIS (Deemed to be University), Jaipur invited Ms Ankita Khatri, Founder ,Sampurna NGO to deliver a lecture on the topic "Sexual Abuse Faced by Children in their Own Four Walls". Ms. Khatri quoted that one in ten girls under the age of 18 experience sexual abuse. It can happen to any child irrespective of caste and background. She talked about the implications of sexual abuse that result in self-blaming and low self-esteem among children. They have to be told how they should not confine such incidents to themselves and make them understand what sexual advances really look like. These acts are not to be tolerated or forgotten but there should be awareness regarding the legal measures to be taken. Ms Anita Khatri also shared some self-defense techniques with the students that can help them in case any emergency. The session was insightful and had a great deal of information for the students. Self-defense techniques were also demonstrated along with some practical tips to remain protected. Also gave a few suggestions to teachers to deal effectively when a student approaches them with such concern. The lecture ended with an oath taking ceremony.115 NSS volunteers participated in the session. The students were made

aware and empowered to raise their voice against any form of sexual abuse. Students also learnt self-defense techniques and protective measures to safeguard their interests.



Celebration of International Day of Persons with Disabilities 3^{rd} December 2021

- "No real change in history has ever been achieved by discussions."


- "Give me blood and I will give you freedom!"




Webinar on "Happiness Lessons from pandemic" $21^{st} \ January \ 2022$


Guest Lecture- Early detection and prevention of Cancer 7th February 2022

The NSS wing of IIS (deemed to be University) organized a webinar on "Prevention and Early Detection of Cancer" in association with HCG Hospital, Jaipur. The speaker for the event was Dr. Jitendra Pehlajani, Consultant Medical Oncology, HCG Hospital, Jaipur. The Lecture was attended by 164 NSS Volunteers.

Dr. Pehlajani started the lecture by explaining about cancer and how we can differentiate cancerous and non-cancerous tumors. He explained 3 types of cancer growth and told that breast cancer is the most common kind of cancer affecting the population. He has also made aware the students about the right time to consult a doctor, how we can prevent the things which can lead to cancer and adopt a healthy way of life. He said healthy life can be achieved by a) good lifestyle including balanced diet, 40-45 minutes of exercise 5 days a week b) get vaccination and c) reduce stress and d) limit exposure to sun after 10am as it can lead to skin cancer. He has also shared that cancer survival rate has improved a lot since the 20th century

due to advancement of technology. In whole lecture his main emphasis was on the importance of early detection, prevention of cancer.

This session seemed successful in achieving its aim to create awareness about cancer in young women.




Skill development Webinar on "Jewelry making through beading art" 14th February 2022




Exhibition: Seeds of Hope and Action 21st February 2022

Schedule of NSS Special Camp 21/02/2022 to 28/02/2022 February 2022

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
DAY 1

The initial section introduces the idea of interconnection with inspiring quotes from different spiritual and faith traditions. There are newly added panels on climate change, the SDGs and the Mapting app, and QR codes now provide links to further information for online use. An interactive page has been created to collect online viewers' ideas for action inspired by the exhibition. The exhibition used the "Learn, Reflect, Empower, Lead" formula outlined in Daisaku Ikeda's proposals on education for sustainable development and is a resource for the UNESCO initiative ESD for 2030.

Swachhta campaign- The day began with a swachhta campaign where students were asked to clean the campus and nearby area. All campers participated enthusiastically and cleaned all nook and corner of the campus and its surrounding areas.

Seminar on "Engaging with the community to become the Change Agent". The speaker of the session was very vibrant Major Dr. Meeta Singh, *Chairperson, Dignity of girl child.* She began the session by making NSS volunteers aware about the Issues faced by a girl in the society and talked about gender equality and women empowerment. Then, she emphasized on some basic tips for effectively engaging with the community and connecting with them during community centric activities for impactful contribution towards the society. She talked about how volunteers should reach out the community through Panchayats and other officials to seek their support, greet the residents of the community always with a smile and greetings, connect with them personally, give an ear to their problems and try giving them practical solutions. She also talked about the importance of maintaining regular communication with them. The session was very important and appropriate in the beginning of the camp for proper and effective execution of community activities during the camp and even after that.





In-house Project- On the second day students were asked to learn five sentences in Asamese language under the project 'Ek Bharat Shreshta Bharat'. Two asamese students were present in the group who taught others five sentences in asamese language. The next activity under the same project was to make them aware abut any two asamese culture specific festival in which the asamese students discussed about Bihu and Majuli Festival.

Next activity was **Yoga session** which was held by Ms. Janaki Pareek from IIS (Deemed to be University) in the University Back lawns. Ms. Pareek inducted the students about the importance of Yoga for a healthy body and a healthy mind. Then she gave a brief introduction of history of Yoga, its importance and some basic asanas of Yoga. The latter half of the session included some basic warm up exercises followed by Suryanamaskaar, and various other asana.







Martial Art training- The day ended with a session on Martial Art training by Mr. Dhananjay Tyagi from *Indian Martial Arts Academy*. Mr. Tyagi started this week long training programme by making the students aware about the importance of Self defence in everybody's life He told, how it boosts one's confidence and ability to deal with difficult situations by having presence of mind and some basic self defence skills. He discussed how women can become both mentally and physically strong enough to fight for themselves and others in times of need by learning some basic techniques. At last he taught several basic-level self defence techniques to the participants and discussed about his action plan for the entire week as well. It was great learning for everyone and it benefitted students a lot.

Nukkad Natak Training

After attending the self defense training students gathered in back lawn area for practicing Nukad natak which they were suppose to perform on the fourth day of the camp. Dr. Aditi R. Khandelwal was the trainer.


DAY 3

The day started with **yoga session** for volunteers of NSS special camp 2022. The instructor for the session was Ms. Janki Pareek. The session was conducted with an objective of making the volunteers physically as well as mentally fit. During the session different asanas were

demonstrated by the instructors. The instructor also provided basic knowledge and information regarding relevance of different asanas to the audience.

Guest lecture on the topic "Adolescent Women and Menstrual Health"- Second activity of the day was a guest lecture on the topic "Adolescent Women and Menstrual Health". The speaker of the session was Ms. Jahanvi Rathore. Ms. Rathore during the session imparted knowledge regarding use of menstrual cups during periods. She started the session by discussing the reasons for using as well as for not using the menstrual cups by the girls. She highlighted the fact that menstrual cups are eco-friendly as compared to tempons. She pictorially explained the correct way of fixing it. She also removed many myths of girls regarding use of these cups. The session ended by addressing the queries of campers.









In house project- Next activity of camp was in house project wherein campers have made different items out of waste material. During the activity, campers have made different items like first aid box, cloth bag, stationary box, candle stand, paper puppet, paper decorative items, item organizars, etc. For making these items the material used are shoe box, waste newspaper, pistachio shell, used plastic bottles, used T – shirt, etc. Towards the end, campers displayed their items and explained how and from which material they made those items. All the items made by campers were very beautiful.









Workshop on jewelry making- After in house project, a workshop on jewelry making from scrape item was organized for campers. The demonstrator for the session was Dr. Neeru Jain. She demonstrated to the campers that how beautiful jewelry items can be made from different scrape item like x-ray film, fabrics, buttons, safety pins, leather, tyre tube, etc. She showed some basic tools and common item which are required to make small jewelry items like ring, ear ring, neckline. She also displayed jewelry out of scrap items made by her to all the campers. Towards the end few campers have made small jewelry items under her supervision.









Next session was of **self defense training** . During the session , campers were taught about different self defense techniques followed by practice for **Nukad Natak** with Dr. Aditi R. Khandelwal.





DAY 4

Yoga session - The 4th day started with Yoga session with Ms. Janki pareek. She trained the students few asnas for making the body flexible and some asnas which helps in increasing stamina.

Session on Laws related to women and child protection- day 3rd of NSS Special Camp 2022, From 9:30 to 10:30 a theoretical session on Laws related to women and child protection was conducted by Aparna Jain. She is a founding partner of knowledgentia consultants. She briefed about the term "Harassment" and the laws related to women and child protection.

In-house Projects: preparation of teaching aids for school children- Students were asked to make teaching aids for children of primary classes on the subject mathematics, science and English. They made beautiful charts, posters, worksheets and few of them also made 3D models.

Session on Anemia among Adolecents- Second session held from 1:30 to 2:30 was conducted by Gargi Saxena, she is presently working as a senior assistant professor in the department of home science at IIS University She has over 12 years of teaching experience. She briefed volunteers about Anaemia and consequences and how to overcome it.

A Question/ Answer round was held after both the seminars in which volunteers questioned the speakers to sate their curiousities.

Self-defence session- From 2:30 to 3:15, was a self-defence session by Mr. Dhananjay Tyagi. He trained volunteers the different attack and defence techniques which can be useful in difficult situations. This was followed by practice for **Nukad Natak** with Dr. Aditi R. Khandelwal.













DAY 5

The fourth day of NSS Special Camp was celebrated on the theme 'Fagootsav' and all the volunteers were traditional attires.

Zumba session - The event commenced with the NSS song and an energetic Zumba session by Mr. Mayur Prajapat. Mr. Mayur is a dancer by profession, also a social worker and has conducted many donation drives. It was a fun and energetic dance workout which moved between high and low intensity dance moves on the beats of Hindi and Punjabi bollywood songs. All the volunteers enthusiastically participated and felt charged up.





Seedball Preparation Workshop - The event was followed by 'Seedball Preparation Workshop' by Mr. Shankar, landscaper at IIS University, Jaipur. Seed balls or seed bombs are seeds that have been wrapped in soil matter and then dried. Seed balls are one of the easiest and most sustainable ways of cultivating plants to win a manner that avails a larger window of time until the sowing window comes. Seed balls are also the best and most convenient way of dispersing seeds. Mr. Shankar demonstrated seed ball preparation with sand, manure and clay in 1:2:1 ratio. He also emphasized on the importance of seedballs.



Performance of Nukkad Natak - Next, The IISU Theatrical Society performed a Nukkad Natak on the theme "What matters the most in Life". Theatre allows us to step into someone else's shoes and see life from their point of view. It was a feast to the eyes to witness such an astounding street play performed on the University Lawn.



Exhibition by women artisans from Self Help Groups- This was followed with an exhibition by women artisans from Self Help Groups which was inaugurated by Hon'ble Chancellor, Sir Ashok Gupta, IISU, wherein village women displayed various beautiful handmade articles like dresses, handbags, purses, jewellery, soaps, pots etc. This was a perfect example of women empowerment. Also, a Rajasthani dance was performed by a group of NSS volunteers.



Celebration of Fagootsav Holi - Thereupon, all the NSS Volunteers danced on Fagootsav holi songs as a part of Fagootsav celebration.

Self Defense session - Finally, day 4 of NSS Special Camp ended with a Self Defense session empowering young women. The coach for the session was Mr. Dhananjay Tyagi. He is a certified martial arts teacher. He taught tools and skills one needs to confidently assess a negative situation and navigate effectively.



DAY 6

Visit to Villages

A visit was organised on day 6 of the camp to 4 villages namely: Hasampura, Muhana, Nevta and Jaisinghpura. Various activities were carried out in all 4 villages.

VISIT TO HASAMPURA VILLAGE

The volunteers and the faculty coordinators went to Hasampura Village. They first went to the 'Hasanpura Government School' where they started the programme by explaining the school students about what is plastic waste and how we reduce the plastic waste which is non-biodegradable and pollutes the environment. They explained the students about the harmful effects of plastic on our environment such as plastic are toxic and detrimental to the human body. It can cause various diseases like cancer, genotoxicity etc. Then the volunteers introduced eco-bricks and demonstrated them the making and usage of eco-bricks and how they can be used to make many things such as furniture, walls and buildings. They also gave the students some tips to avoid plastic usage and wastage.

Following that, stationary sets were distributed among the students and the volunteers played

some fun Swatchhta games with them.







volunteers and the faculty coordinators then visited village community, gathered women and explained them the usage of candle and demonstrated them different ways on how to make candles at home and save money, through which they can also involve themselves in a small profit business. Then they told them about the importance of masks and their usage. The volunteers and teachers then distributed handmade cloth masks to the villagers and asked them to wear masks whenever they at any public place.

Along with teaching in order to make learning fun students were encouraged for story telling and poem recitation too.

During the first and the second wave of Covid -19, it was impossible for the institutions to

reach out to communities in person, but on virtual platforms, interaction could be maintained. The prevalence of the pandemic has exposed us to the various social-economic problems. Apart from the problems of health infrastructure, the world also suffered from sudden loss of employment owing to the situation of lockdown. We live in a world of new uncertainties which require us to be more prepared and responsible. Rural communities suffered more on the economic front because of the dependence on sub-urban and urban areas for commercial activities. So, it was decided by the University to focus on awareness, advocacy and skill development to start addressing the concern especially from the Covid perspective.

The visit was scheduled on 26th February,2022 . There were 36 students who participated in the field visit to Jaisinghpura. The aim of the visit to interact with the women of the village and spread awareness regarding the relevance of hygiene is post-Covid era and also to take a note of the problems that were specific to the Covid time-period. The second activity was to visit the government school where we distributed stationery kits to the students and also there was a poster-making activity in which students from the school and university were involved. The theme of the poster-making was environmental awareness /Personal Hygiene . The last activity of the day was a rally by the students on literacy.

Talk on Hygiene in the Post-covid times

For this activity, women from the village households were invited for an informal and interactive discussion on the idea of cleanliness. The resource person was Ms Anjali Anand, Department of Sociology, IIS(deemed to be University), Jaipur. The talk began with asking women about the cleanliness measures that they have taken in the wake of covid 19 pandemic . The women replied that they are able to ensure that the homes are clean but making sure of the clean surroundings is being a difficult task as there are problems regarding dumping the waste and also near the water tank , there is water accumulation which is posing difficulty for the people. It was noted that women were aware of the fact that masks need to be worn as the pandemic is still spreading but

they also said that there are hardly in cases of the disease here and things are otherwise well-controlled. On being asked if they experienced economic pressure because of the lockdown ,women responded that they all managed but they also felt the need to work outside homes as well. They expressed their interest in learning sewing, embroidery and also they are prepared to receive some formal training for the same. It seems that Covid 19 pandemic has led women to understand that they should also learn skills and contribute in economic sense so that there is a better preparedness in the case of unexpected economic challenges.

Activities at the school

In the school, the volunteers from the University asked the students to poster-making. It was a group activity in which students participated happily bringing their ideas to paper. The posters drawn were a reflection of the fact that they are envision a cleaner and greener environment. It was a creative way to express what kind of understanding they have developed in terms of environmental issues. It was a learning experience for the students through colourful and funfilled way. The activity was interactive as the student volunteers discussed the relevance of cleanliness as well as the benefits of having a clean environment. Stationery kits were distributed to the children of Anganwadi and primary classes to motivate them as the examination season is approaching

Rally on Literacy

Towards the end of the visit, students took out an awareness rally on literacy. As we know that Covid 19 has pushed a lot of students out of the schooling system in the absence of access to virtual media for education or because of financial problems. This rally was a reminder that education is an instrument of transformation and we have to try our best to address the barriers. We must keep our interest in learning alive so that we can experience desirable social changes. The visit in a lot of ways highlighted the need to promoted women entrepreneurship in Jaisinghpura and also there must more focus on environmental awareness. It was a great experience of engaging with the community.

DAY 7

On day 7 visit to Government primary and upper primary school was organised. Studets of four units visited and conducted various activities in the scjools of Haziawala, sumernagar, Kalyanpura and Dadabari.

VISIT TO HAZIYAWALA GOVERNMENT SCHOOLS

The NSS Wing of IIS Deemed to be University, Jaipur organized a seven days NSS Special Camp from 22nd to 28th February. On the last day of NSS special camp the volunteers visited the Hazyawala Government School. The theme of the visit was "Birthday Celebration". Those school going children who were not unable to celebrate their birthdays, the NSS group D volunteers organized a birthday party for them. The celebration was started by showing a cartoon movie which was filled up with the moral values. From the movie they learned values like washing hands after and before eating and also after using washroom, not to talk while eating, respect teachers and elderly people, etc. The Volunteers then celebrated their birthday decorating the school with balloons and other decorative stuff and cake was cut by all children. The volunteers also played some birthday games with them and distributed chocolates to them.

All the children enthusiastically danced with volunteers and faculty coordinators and enjoyed a lot. It was a very enjoyable and fun day for all the children.



VISIT TO SUMERNAGAR GOVERNMENT SCHOOL

28th February 2022, the Last day of the NSS special camp 2022 started with the great enthusiasm as every volunteer was so excited to visit the Sumer Nagar primary government school assigned to them. Around 30 volunteers of unit II along with two coordinators went to Sumer Nagar School. NSS volunteers conducted three activities in the school – teaching in senior classes, creating awareness about general issues of concern and stationary donation drive.

For the first activity of teaching, some of the volunteers went to class 4 and class 5 and taught Maths and English to the students. Volunteers have also solved many subject related problems of the students. They also discussed with the students some tips to remain relaxed and tension free during the up-coming examinations. All the volunteers were happy and elated after meeting and interacting with the students.

The next activity conducted at school was to display posters at school. In order to make every student of school aware about the general issues of concern like save water, swachhta, etc. the volunteers had displayed hand-made posters at different places within the school premises. VISIT TO DADABADI GOVERNMENT SCHOOL

NSS Volunteers of NSS Unit I of IIS (deemed to be University) went for a visit to Dadabari Government School on 28.02.22. The purpose of the visit was to fill the gap developed in teaching - learning of the students due to COVID 19. The students have lagged behind a lot due to the pandemic and thereby need identification was done by discussion with the school management to fill the gap. In order to expedite the learning process, several attractive and interactive teaching aids were prepared by NSS Volunteers for basic subjects English, Hindi and Mathematics as per the syllabus followed by the School. Activity on Single Use Plastic

The plastic generation in India is increasing every day. Annually more than 5 million tonnes of plastic goes to waste, which can be managed better at personal level, segregated at home and upcycled. As a result of many government initiatives and awareness created through private organisation, the use of single-use plastics has been reduced. But still a lot has to be

done to save our environment from this non-biodegradable waste. The IIS (deemed to be University), organised a campaign on "Recycling Single Use Plastic" aims at reducing and reusing plastic and upcycling the non-biodegradable plastic waste generated at home and communities.
